The Department of Children and Families is provided sole responsibility for these tasks.
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24	Shifts the objectives of the workgroup to developing administrative rules pertaining to the definition of supportive housing services, consumer health and safety and the use of Department of Children and Families funded subsidies.
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27	Expands the membership of the workgroup and eliminates the requirement that there be equal representation from each entity.
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29	Changes the action taken on the workgroup recommendations from submission to the Governor and legislature to incorporating the recommendations into the January 2003 update of the Mental Health and Substance Abuse master plan.
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
