WHEREAS, arthritis encompasses more than 100 diseases and conditions that affect joints, the surrounding tissues, and other connective tissues, and

WHEREAS, arthritis is the leading case of disability in the United States, limiting daily activities for more than 7 million individuals, and

WHEREAS, this disease has a significant effect on quality of life, not only for the individual who experiences its painful symptoms and resulting disability, but also for family members and caregivers, and

WHEREAS, the enormous economic and social costs associated with treating arthritis and its complications are estimated at almost \$80 billion annually in the United States, and

1 WHEREAS, currently the challenge exists to ensure 2 delivery of effective, but often underutilized, interventions 3 that are necessary in the prevention or reduction of arthritis-related pain and disability, and 4 5 WHEREAS, although there exists a large quantity of 6 public information and programs about arthritis, it remains 7 inadequately disseminated and insufficient in addressing the 8 needs of specific diverse populations and other underserved 9 groups, and 10 WHEREAS, the Arthritis Foundation, Florida Chapter, the 11 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials have led 12 the development of a public-health strategy, the National 13 14 Arthritis Action Plan, to respond to this challenge, and 15 WHEREAS, Educating the public and the health-care community throughout the state about this devastating disease 16 17 is of paramount importance and is in every respect in the public interest and to the benefit of all residents of the 18 19 State of Florida, NOW, THEREFORE, 20 21 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 22 23 Section 1. Section 385.21, Florida Statutes, is 24 created to read: 25 385.21 Arthritis Prevention and Control Act; purposes; 26 program; needs assessment; advisory panel; public awareness.--27 (1) SHORT TITLE. -- This section may be cited as the 28 'Arthritis Prevention and Control Act."

PURPOSES. -- The purposes of this section are:

causes of arthritis, the importance of early diagnosis and appropriate management, effective prevention strategies, and pain prevention and management;

- To develop knowledge and enhance understanding of arthritis by disseminating educational materials, information on research results, services provided, and strategies for prevention and control to patients, health professionals, and the public;
- (c) To establish a solid scientific base of knowledge on the prevention of arthritis and related disability through surveillance, epidemiology, and prevention research;
- (d) To use educational and training resources and services developed by organizations that have appropriate expertise and knowledge of arthritis and to use available technical assistance.
- To evaluate the need for improving the quality and accessibility of existing community-based arthritis services;
- To heighten awareness about the prevention, detection, and treatment of arthritis among state and local health and human-services officials, health professionals and providers, and policymakers;
- To implement and coordinate state and local programs and services to reduce the public-health burden of arthritis; and
- (h) To provide lasting improvements in the delivery of health care for individuals who have arthritis and their families, thus improving their quality of life while also containing health-care costs.
- (3) ARTHRITIS PREVENTION AND CONTROL PROGRAM. -- The Department of Health shall establish, promote, and maintain an Arthritis Prevention and Control Program for the purposes of 31

raising public awareness, educating consumers, and educating and training healthcare professionals, teachers, and human 2 3 services providers, and for other related purposes. (4) NEEDS ASSESSMENT.--The department shall conduct a 4 5 needs assessment to identify: (a) Epidemiological and other public-health research 6 7 that is being conducted within the state; 8 (b) Available technical assistance and educational 9 materials and programs nationwide and within the state; 10 (C) The level of public and professional arthritis 11 awareness; (d) The needs of people who have arthritis, their 12 13 families, and their caregivers; (e) Educational and support-service needs of 14 healthcare providers, including physicians, nurses, 15 managed-care organizations, and other healthcare providers; 16 17 The services available to a person who has (f) arthritis; 18 19 (g) The existence of arthritis treatment, self-management, physical activity, and other education 20 21 programs; and The existence of rehabilitation services. 22 (h) ADVISORY PANEL ON ARTHRITIS. -- The Department of 23 (5) 24 Health shall establish and coordinate an Advisory Panel on 25 Arthritis, to provide nongovernmental input regarding the Arthritis Prevention and Control Program. Membership on the 26 27 panel shall include, but is not limited to, persons who have 28 arthritis, public-health educators, medical experts on 29 arthritis, providers of arthritis health care, persons who are 30 knowledgeable in health promotion and education, and

1 representatives of national arthritis organizations and their 2 local chapters. 3 (6) PUBLIC AWARENESS. -- The department shall use, but 4 is not limited to, strategies that are consistent with the 5 National Arthritis Action Plan and existing state planning 6 efforts to raise public awareness and knowledge of the causes 7 and nature of arthritis, personal risk factors, the value of prevention and early detection, ways to minimize preventable 8 9 pain, and options for diagnosing and treating the disease. 10 (7)CONTRIBUTIONS. -- The Secretary of Health may accept, from the Federal Government, foundations, 11 12 organizations, medical schools, and other entities, whatever grants, services, and property are available for the purposes 13 14 of fulfilling the obligations of this program. 15 Section 2.
