2	An act relating to Broward County; extending
3	the corporate limits of the Cities of Fort
4	Lauderdale, Lauderdale Lakes, and Oakland Park;
5	providing for annexation of the unincorporated
6	area known as "Rock Island"; providing for a
7	study; providing for an election; providing for
8	a runoff election; providing for an effective
9	date of annexation; providing for an interlocal
10	agreement; providing for a continuation of
11	certain Broward County regulations; providing
12	for the transfer of public roads and
13	rights-of-way; providing an effective date.

15	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
16	
17	Section 1. The legal description of the "Rock Island
18	Area" is as follows:
19	
20	That portion of Sections 28 and 29, Township 49
21	South, Range 42 East, Broward County, Florida,
22	described as follows:
23	
24	Beginning at a point on the municipal boundary
25	of the City of Fort Lauderdale, as established
26	by Chapter 69 - 1057, Laws of Florida, being
27	the intersection of the North Right of way line
28	of NW 19 Street with the West right-of-way line
29	of the Seaboard Coastline Railroad;

31	

1	thence along said municipal boundary of the
2	City of Fort Lauderdale, the following 7
3	courses;
4	
5	thence westerly along said North right-of-way
6	line of NW 19 Street to the Southeast corner
7	of Lot 1, Block 1 of "North West Lauderdale",
8	as recorded in Plat Book 25, Page 25, of the
9	Public Records of Broward County, Florida;
10	
11	thence Northerly to the Northeast corner of Lot
12	4 in said Block 1;
13	
14	thence Westerly to the Northwest corner of said
15	Lot 4;
16	
17	thence Southerly to the Southwest corner of
18	said Lot 1 and the North right-of-way line of
19	NW 19 Street;
20	
21	thence Westerly along said North right-of-way
22	line to the East right-of-way line of NW 31
23	Avenue;
24	
25	thence Northerly along said East right-of-way
26	line to the North boundary of the South
27	one-half (S1/2) of the South one-half (S1/2) of
28	the Southwest one-quarter (SW 1/4) of said
29	Section 29;
30	
31	

1	thence Westerly along said North boundary to
2	the West line of said Section 29;
3	
4	thence along the municipal boundary of the City
5	of Lauderdale Lakes, as established by
6	Ordinance 40, of the City of Lauderdale Lakes,
7	the following three (3) courses:
8	
9	thence North along said West line to the South
10	line of the Southwest one-quarter (SW1/4) of
11	the Southwest one-quarter (SW1/4) of the
12	Northwest one-quarter (NW1/4) of said Section
13	<u>29;</u>
14	
15	thence East along said South line to the
16	Southeast corner of said Southwest one-quarter
17	(SW1/4) of the Southwest one-quarter $(SW1/4)$ of
18	the Northwest one-quarter (NW 1/4);
19	
20	thence North along the East line of said
21	Southwest one-quarter (SW1/4) of the Southwest
22	one-quarter (SW1/4) of the Northwest
23	one-quarter (NW1/4) to a line 35.00 feet north
24	of and parallel with the South line of the
25	North one-half (N1/2) of said Section 29, also
26	being a point on the municipal boundary of the
27	City of Oakland Park, as established by
28	Ordinance 477, of the City of Oakland Park;
29	
30	thence along said municipal boundary of the
31	City of Oakland Park and along said parallel

1	line to a line 100.00 feet west of and parallel
2	with the East line of the West one-half (W1/2)
3	of the West one-half (W1/2) of the Southwest
4	one-quarter (SW1/4) of the Northeast
5	one-quarter (NE1/4) of said Section 29;
6	
7	thence along the municipal boundary of the City
8	of Oakland Park, as established by Chapter
9	79-519, Laws of Florida , the following four
10	(4) courses:
11	
12	thence South along said parallel line, also
13	being a line 270.00 feet West of the West
14	right-of-way line of NW 26 Avenue, to the South
15	right-of-way line of NW 26 Street;
16	
17	thence Easterly along said South right-of-way
18	line to the East right-of-way line of NW 21
19	Avenue;
20	
21	thence North along said East right-of-way line
22	to the South line of the Northwest one-quarter
23	(NW 1/4) of said Section 28;
24	
25	thence East along said South line to the West
26	right-of-way line of the Seaboard Coastline
27	Railroad;
28	
29	thence along the municipal boundary of the City
30	of Oakland Park, as established by Chapter
31	83-476, Laws of Florida, and Southwesterly along

1 said West right-of-way line to the Point of 2 Beginning. 3 Section 2. The Broward County Board of County 4 5 Commissioners shall schedule an election in accordance with 6 the provisions of the law relating to elections, currently in 7 force in Broward County on September 10, 2002. The subject of 8 said election shall be the annexation of the area described in section 1, commonly known as the "Rock Island Area." Only 9 10 registered voters residing in the Rock Island Area, as 11 described in this act, may vote in said election. The name of each municipality to be considered for annexation in 12 accordance with this section shall appear on the ballot. The 13 voters residing in the Rock Island Area shall, by majority 14 vote of the voters participating in the election, choose one 15 municipality for annexation. 16 17 Section 3. The Rock Island Area shall be deemed a part 18 of the municipality receiving a majority of the votes of the 19 registered voters residing in the Rock Island Area voting for annexation into the City of Fort Lauderdale, the City of 20 21 Lauderdale Lakes, or the City of Oakland Park, effective September 15, 2003, pursuant to section 171.062, Florida 22 Statutes, except as provided for in this act. If no entity 23 24 receives a majority vote of those voting as provided for in section 2, there shall be a runoff election scheduled for 25 Tuesday, November 5, 2002, between the two entities which have 26 27 received the highest number of votes in the election of September 10, 2002. 28 29 Section 4. If a runoff election is necessitated as 30 provided for in section 3, the Rock Island Area shall be 31

deemed annexed to the municipality which has received a majority vote of those voters voting in the runoff election. 2 3 Section 5. An interlocal agreement shall be developed between the governing bodies of Broward County and the 4 5 annexing municipality and executed prior to the effective date 6 of the annexation as provided for in section 3. The agreement 7 shall include a financially feasible plan for transitioning 8 county services, buildings, infrastructure, waterways, and 9 employees. 10 Section 6. The Board of County Commissioners of 11 Broward County is hereby authorized to set the election provided for in section 2 by general election for the time 12 period provided in this act at the cost of Broward County. A 13 14 mail ballot shall not be used for any election provided for in 15 this act. Section 7. Upon annexation into a municipality, the 16 17 following shall govern the areas described in section 1: The present land use designations and zoning 18 19 districts provided for under the Broward County Comprehensive Plan and Code of Ordinances of Broward County shall remain the 20 21 law governing the Rock Island Area, notwithstanding the fact that the Rock Island Area is now a part of a municipality. 22 The land use designations and zoning of Broward County shall 23 24 be deemed the conforming laws of the municipality of which the 25 Rock Island Area is now a part. (2) Any change of zoning districts or land use 26 27 designations may only be accomplished by enactment of the vote 28 of the majority of the full governing body of a municipality 29 plus one. (3) Notwithstanding subsections (1) and (2), any use, 30

31 | building, or structure that is legally in existence at the

time that the Rock Island Area becomes a part of a municipality shall not be made a prohibited use by a 2 3 municipality, on the property of the use, for as long as the use shall continue and is not voluntarily abandoned. 4 Section 8. Subsequent to the effective date of this 5 6 act, no change in land use designation or zoning shall be 7 effective within the limits of the lands subject to annexation 8 under this act until the Rock Island Area has been annexed into the municipality; no annexation within the Rock Island 9 10 Area by any municipality shall occur during the time period 11 between the effective date of this act and the effective date 12 of the annexation. Section 9. All public roads and the public 13 14 rights-of-way associated therewith on the Broward County Road 15 System, lying within the limits of the lands subject to annexation herein, as described in section 1, are transferred 16 from Broward County jurisdiction to the jurisdiction of the 17 annexing municipality, except N.W. 31st Avenue and N.W. 21st 18 19 Avenue lying within the limits of the annexation area. All rights, title, interests, and responsibilities for any 20 transferred roads, including, but not limited to, the 21 ownership, operation, maintenance, planning, design, and 22 construction of said roads and to the rights-of-way associated 23 24 therewith shall transfer from Broward County jurisdiction and ownership to the jurisdiction and ownership of the annexing 25 municipality upon the effective date of the annexation. 26 27 Section 10. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 28 law. 29 30 31
