17	Section 1. Paragraph (ee) is added to subsection (3)
18	of section 119.07, Florida Statutes, to read:
19	119.07 Inspection, examination, and duplication of
20	records; exemptions

22	(ee) A photograph, digital image, video recording, or
23	other reproduction of a crime scene which is in the custody of
24	a state or other governmental agency and which reveals the
25	remains of a victim of the crime is confidential and exempt
26	from subsection (1) and s. $24(a)$ , Art. I of the State
27	Constitution. However, this paragraph does not prohibit a
28	state or other governmental agency from releasing a record
29	made confidential under this paragraph to another agency for
30	official purposes, and such release does not waive the

1 subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2 3 2, 2007, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 4 5 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public б necessity that a photograph, digital image, video recording, 7 or other reproduction of a crime scene which reveals the 8 remains of a victim of the crime be made confidential and exempt from section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and Section 9 10 24(a) of Article I of the State Constitution. The Legislature 11 finds that photographs or other images of a crime scene which depict the remains of a victim of the crime are often graphic 12 and disturbing to persons who view the photographs or images. 13 Such photographs or images, if copied or publicized, could 14 result in trauma, sorrow, humiliation, or emotional injury to 15 the immediate family of the victim, as well as injury to the 16 memory of the victim. The Legislature finds that the existence 17 of the World Wide Web and the proliferation of personal 18 19 computers encourages and promotes the wide dissemination of photographs and other images, and that widespread, 20 unauthorized dissemination of photographs or other images that 21 depict the remains of a victim of a crime would subject the 22 23 immediate family of the victim to continuous injury. 24 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 25 law. 26 27 28 29 30 31
