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16	WHEREAS, the waterways of Citrus and Hernando Counties
17	are of historic, hydrological, and ecological significance,
18	and
19	WHEREAS, most of these Citrus/Hernando waterways are
20	Outstanding Florida Waterways or in the application process,
21	and
22	WHEREAS, the Citrus/Hernando waterways are plagued by
23	fluctuating water levels and sedimentation increasing nitrate
24	levels and sand movement causing blockage of natural springs
25	and excessive growth of aquatic plants, which are degrading
26	their water quality and recreational value, and
27	WHEREAS, despite their current problems, the
28	Citrus/Hernando waterways continue to provide wildlife habitat
29	for fish, birds, and game and offer recreational opportunities
30	for the residents of Citrus and Hernando Counties and visitors
31	to the area, and

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1 WHEREAS, the renewable economic potential of the 2 Citrus/Hernando waterways is significant, and 3 WHEREAS, the Southwest Florida Water Management 4 District and the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, 5 along with other state, regional, and local entities, have 6 developed proposals to restore portions of the Citrus/Hernando 7 waterways, NOW, THEREFORE, 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 10 11 Section 1. (1) The Citrus/Hernando Waterways Restoration Council. -- There is created within the 12 13 Withlacoochee and Coastal Rivers Basin Boards of the Southwest 14 Florida Water Management District a council to be known as the 15 Citrus/Hernando Waterways Restoration Council. The council shall be coordinated by representatives of the following 16 17 agencies: the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, the Department of Environmental Protection, and 18 19 the Southwest Florida Water Management District. The council is subject to the provisions of chapters 119 and 120, Florida 20 21 Statutes. 22 (2) Members of the council shall consist of twelve voting members with six appointed by the President of the 23 24 Senate and six appointed by the Speaker of the House of 25 Representatives. The council shall consist of representatives as follows: 26 2.7 Waterfront property owners from each county, 28 An attorney from each county, 29 A member of the Board of Directors of the Chamber

An environmental engineer from each county,

of Commerce from each county,

- e. An engineer from each county, and
- <u>f. A person from each county with training in biology</u> or another scientific discipline.
- (3) The council members from each county are to form two separate county task forces from the council to review and make recommendations on specific waterways. The Hernando County Task Force shall develop plans for the restoration of the Weeki Wachee River and Springs. The Citrus County Task Force shall develop plans for the restoration of the Tsala-Apopka Chain of Lakes.
- (4) There shall be a technical advisory group to the council and the two county task forces which shall consist of one representative each from the Southwest Florida Water

  Management District, the Department of Environmental

  Protection, the Department of Transportation, the Fish and

  Wildlife Conservation Commission, the Coastal Rivers Basin

  Board, the Withlacoochee River Basin Board, and the United

  States Army Corps of Engineers, each of whom shall be

  appointed by his or her respective agency, and each of whom,

  with the exception of the representatives from the

  Withlacoochee River Basin Board and Coastal Rivers Basin

  Board, shall have had training in biology or another

  scientific discipline.
- (5) Immediately after appointment, the council shall meet and organize by electing a chair, a vice chair, and a secretary, whose terms shall be for 2 years each. Council officers shall not serve consecutive terms. Each council member shall be a voting member. Additionally, the two county task forces shall elect a chair and a secretary whose terms shall be for 2 years each.

- (6) The council or the county task forces shall meet at the call of its chair, at the request of six of its members, or at the request of the chair of the governing board of the Southwest Florida Water Management District.
  - (7) The council shall have the powers and duties to:
- (a) Review audits and all data specifically related to lake and river restoration techniques and sport fish population recovery strategies, including data and strategies for shoreline restoration, sand and other sediment control and removal, exotic species management, floating tussock management or removal, navigation, water quality, and fish and wildlife habitat improvement, particularly as they may apply to the Citrus/Hernando waterways.
  - (b) Evaluate whether additional studies are needed.
- (c) Explore all possible sources of funding to conduct the restoration activities.
- (d) Report to the Speaker of the House of
  Representatives and the President of the Senate before
  November 25 of each year on the progress of the
  Citrus/Hernando Waterways restoration program and any
  recommendations for the next fiscal year.
- (8) The Southwest Florida Water Management District shall act as lead entity for the purpose of providing staff and administrative support to assist the council in carrying out the provisions of this act.
- (9) Members of the council shall receive no compensation for their services, but are entitled to be reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses incurred during execution of their official duties, as provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes. State and federal agencies shall be responsible for the per diem and travel expenses of their

The Citrus/Hernando Waterways restoration 4 5 program. --6 (1) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and 7 the Southwest Florida Water Management District, in 8 conjunction with the Department of Environmental Protection, pertinent local governments, and the Citrus/Hernando Waterways 9 Restoration Council, shall review existing restoration 10 11 proposals to determine which ones are the most environmentally sound and economically feasible methods of improving the fish 12 and wildlife habitat and natural systems of the 13 14 Citrus/Hernando waterways. (2) To initiate the Citrus/Hernando Waterways 15 restoration program recommended by the Citrus/Hernando 16 17 Waterways Restoration Council, the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, with assistance from the Southwest 18 19 Florida Water Management District and in consultation and by agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection and 20 pertinent local governments, shall develop tasks to be 21 considered by those entities for the enhancement of fish and 22 wildlife habitat. These tasks shall include the following: 23 24 (a) An evaluation of different methodologies for 25 removing the extensive tussocks and buildup of organic matter along the shoreline and of the aquatic vegetation in the lake. 26 27 The conduct of any additional studies as required 28 by the Citrus/Hernando Waterways Restoration Council.

2	<u>SB 374</u>
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4	Removes requirement that Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission be the lead agency. Adds that the Southwest Florida
5	Water Management District is to be the lead entity for the purpose of providing staff to assist the Council. Suggests,
6	rather than requires, the completion of certain tasks for the enhancement of fish and wildlife habitats. Removes sections of
7	the bill that required the award of contracts to implement the restoration program, provided a \$45,000 appropriation, and
8	authorized restoration projects on the Tsala-Apopka Chain of Lakes and Weeki Wachee.
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
