- (c) "Specialty prop-craft" means a watercraft that is similar in appearance and operation to a personal watercraft but that is powered by an outboard or propeller-driven motor.

- (b) "Motor vehicle" means a vehicle that is propelled by power other than muscular power, that is operated on the roads of this state, and that is used to transport persons or property. The term does not include a traction engine, road roller, motorcycle, moped, scooter, or bicycle.
- (c) "Railroad train" means a steam engine,
 electric-powered engine, or other motor engine that is
 operated upon rails, with or without a car coupled to the
 engine, or a car that is or can be coupled to such an engine
 and that is operated upon rails.
