295.02 Use of funds; age, etc.--All sums appropriated and expended under this chapter shall be used to pay tuition and registration fees, board, and room rent and to buy books and supplies for the children of deceased or disabled veterans or service members, as defined and limited in s. 295.01, s. 295.016, s. 295.017, s. 295.018, s. 295.0185, or s. 295.0195, or of parents classified as prisoners of war or missing in action, as defined and limited in s. 295.015, who are between the ages of $\underline{12}$ $\underline{16}$ and 22 years and who are in attendance at a state-supported institution of higher learning, including a community college or vocational-technical school. Any child having entered upon a course of training or education under
