## I. SUMMARY:

Section 334.071, F.S., explains the process for the Legislature to designate roads, bridges, and other transportation facilities for honorary or memorial purposes.

The bill designates the following roads and bridges:

- The new U.S. Highway 27 bridge in the city of Moore Haven in Glades County is designated the "Mamie Langdale Memorial Bridge."
- The old Nassau Sound Bridge on State Road 105 in Nassau and Duval counties is designated the "George Crady Bridge."
- The Thomasville Road "Flyover" (Bridge # 550122) is designated the "Veterans Memorial Bridge."
- A portion of U.S. 17 is designated the "Doyle Parker Memorial Highway."
- A portion of State Road 77 is designated the "Lynn Haven Parkway."
- The New River Bridge on State Road 16 is designated the "John S. "Steve" Dennard Bridge."
- A portion of State Road 121 is designated the "Ed Fraser Memorial Highway."
- A portion of State Road 16 is designated the "Correctional Officers Memorial Highway."
- A portion of U.S. 41 is designated the "Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial Highway."
- A portion of Interstate 75 is designated the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway."
- The new Rose Bay bridges on U.S. 1 between the Cities of New Smyrna Beach and Port Orange are dedicated in honor of POWs and MIAs.
- A portion of State Road 100 between the Towns of Flagler Beach and Bunnell is designated "Veterans Memorial Highway."
- A portion of U.S. 17 from Crescent City to the Putnam/Volusia County line is designated the "Jerome A. Williams Memorial Highway."
- Highway 17 in Seminole County is designated the "Korean War Veterans Memorial Highway."

The bill directs the Florida Department of Transportation (DOT) to erect suitable markers at either end of the roads and bridges, noting the designations. The bill has an estimated minimum initial fiscal impact of \$5,000 to DOT for producing and installing the markers.

The bill takes effect upon becoming a law.

<u>Less Government:</u> State government is required to fund, erect, and maintain suitable markers.

#### B. PRESENT SITUATION:

Section 334.071, F.S., explains the process for legislative designations of transportation facilities for honorary or memorial purposes, or to distinguish a particular facility. The legislative designations do not erase the current names of the facilities, nor do they require local governments and private entities to change street signs or addresses. Some public roads and bridges have multiple or overlapping designations.

Based on DOT records, 969 honorary road and bridge designations have been approved since 1922, most of them by the Legislature.

# C. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

The bill designates the following two roads and bridges:

- The new U.S. Highway 27 bridge in the city of Moore Haven in Glades County is designated the "Mamie Langdale Memorial Bridge," and
- The old Nassau Sound Bridge on State Road 105 in Nassau and Duval counties is designated the "George Crady Bridge."
- The Thomasville Road "Flyover" (Bridge # 550122) is designated the "Veterans Memorial Bridge."
- U.S. 17, from Wauchula to Bowling Green is designated the "Doyle Parker Memorial Highway."
- State Road 77, between Baldwin Road and Mowat School Road, is designated the "Lynn Haven Parkway."
- The New River Bridge on State Road 16 is designated the "John S. "Steve" Dennard Bridge."
- State Road 121, from the Georgia-Florida line to the city limits of Lake Butler in Union County, is designated the "Ed Fraser Memorial Highway."
- State Road 16, from the southwestern city limits of Starke in Bradford County to State Road 121 in Union County, is designated the "Correctional Officers Memorial Highway."
- U.S. 41 in White Springs in Hamilton County is designated the "Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial Highway."
- Interstate 75, from the Georgia-Florida line to the city limits of Ocala, is designated the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway."

- A portion of State Road 100 between the Towns of Flagler Beach and Bunnell is designated "Veterans Memorial Highway."
- A portion of U.S. 17 from Crescent City to the Putnam/Volusia County line is designated the "Jerome A. Williams Memorial Highway."
- Highway 17 in Seminole County is designated the "Korean War Veterans Memorial Highway."

The bill also directs DOT to erect suitable markers announcing the designations.

DOT expects initially to incur an estimated minimum cost of \$5,000 to implement the bill. Production and installation costs are estimated at \$250 per marker, at a minimum, and each designated road or bridge gets two markers. (DOT is in the process of revising its estimated cost per marker to \$400; in that case, the estimated fiscal impact of the bill is \$8,000.)

DOT also expects indeterminate recurring costs of maintaining these signs and replacing them, over time.

- A portion of U.S. 41 is designated the "Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial Highway."
- A portion of Interstate 75 is designated the "Purple Heart Memorial Highway."

On January 29, 2002, the Council for Ready Infrastructure adopted four amendments that added four road or bridge designations:

- The new Rose Bay bridges on U.S. 1 between the Cities of New Smyma Beach and Port Orange are dedicated in honor of POWs and MIAs.
- A portion of State Road 100 between the Towns of Flagler Beach and Bunnell is designated "Veterans Memorial Highway."
