## I. <u>SUMMARY</u>:

Section 334.071, F.S., explains the process for the Legislature to designate roads, bridges and other transportation facilities for honorary or memorial purposes.

HB 457 designates the following two bridges:

- □ The new U.S. Highway 27 bridge in the city of Moore Haven in Glades County is designated the "Mamie Langdale Memorial Bridge," and
- The old Nassau Sound Bridge on State Road 105 in Nassau and Duval counties is designated the "George Crady Bridge."

The bill directs the Florida Department of Transportation (DOT) to erect suitable markers at either end of the bridges, noting the designations.

HB 457 has an estimated initial fiscal impact of \$1,000 to DOT for producing and installing the markers.

The bill takes effect upon becoming a law.

## B. PRESENT SITUATION:

Section 334.071, F.S., explains the process for legislative designations of transportation facilities for honorary or memorial purposes, or to distinguish a particular facility. The legislative designations do not erase the current names of the facilities, nor do they require local governments and private entities to change street signs or addresses. Some public roads and bridges have multiple or overlapping designations.

Based on DOT records, 969 honorary road and bridge designations have been approved since 1922, most of them by the Legislature.

C. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

HB 457 designates the following two bridges:

- □ The new U.S. Highway 27 bridge in the city of Moore Haven in Glades County is designated the "Mamie Langdale Memorial Bridge," and
- The old Nassau Sound Bridge on State Road 105 in Nassau and Duval counties is designated the "George Crady Bridge."

Also, the bill directs the Florida Department of Transportation (DOT) to erect suitable markers announcing the designations.

D. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS:

**Section 1:** Designates the new U.S. Highway 27 bridge in Moore Haven the "Mamie Langdale Memorial Bridge." Directs DOT to erect markers.

**Section 2:** Designates the old Nassau Bridge on State Road 105 in Nassau and Duval counties the George Crady Bridge." Directs DOT to erect markers.

**Section 3:** Specifies this act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

DOT expects initially to incur an estimated cost of \$1,000 to implement the bill. Production and installation costs are estimated at \$250 per marker, and each designated road gets two markers. DOT also expects indeterminate recurring costs of maintaining these signs and replacing them, over time.
