## I. Summary:

This CS designates various roads or bridges throughout Florida.

### Present Situation:

Section 334.071, F.S., provides that any designation of a transportation facility contained in an act of the Legislature is for honorary or memorial purposes or to distinguish a particular facility, and may not be construed to require any action by local government or private parties regarding the changing of any street signs, mailing address, or 911 emergency telephone number system listing, unless the legislation specifically provides for such changes. The section further provides when the Legislature establishes road or bridge designations the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is required to place markers only at the termini specified for each highway segment or bridge designated by the law creating the designation.

## II. Effect of Proposed Changes:

The CS designates the following roads and bridges:

- The new U.S. Highway 27 bridge in the city of Moore Haven in Glades County is designated the “Mamie Langdale Memorial Bridge.”
- The old Nassau Sound Bridge on State Road 105 in Nassau and Duval counties is designated the “George Crady Bridge.”
- The Thomasville Road “Flyover” (Bridge # 550122) is designated the “Veterans Memorial Bridge.”
- A portion of U.S. 17 is designated the “Doyle Parker Memorial Highway.”
- A portion of State Road 77 is designated the “Lynn Haven Parkway.”

- The New River Bridge on State Road 16 is designated the “John S. “Steve” Dennard Bridge.”
- A portion of State Road 121 is designated the “Ed Fraser Memorial Highway.”
- A portion of State Road 16 is designated the “Correctional Officers Memorial Highway.”
- A portion of U.S. 41 is designated the “Martin Luther King, Jr., Memorial Highway.”
- A portion of Interstate 75 is designated the “Purple Heart Memorial Highway.”
- The new Rose Bay bridges on U.S. 1 between the Cities of New Smyrna Beach and Port Orange are dedicated in honor of POW’s and MIA’s.
- A portion of State Road 100 between the Towns of Flagler Beach and Bunnell is designated “Veterans Memorial Highway.”
- A portion of U.S. 17 from Crescent City to the Putnam/Volusia County line is designated the “Jerome A. Williams Memorial Highway.”
- Highway 17 in Seminole County is designated the “Korean War Veterans Memorial Highway.”
- A portion of Semoran Boulevard in the City of Orlando in Orange County beginning at the Bee Line Expressway (State Road 528) on the South to Curry Ford Road on the North is designated the “Toni Jennings Boulevard.”

The CS takes effect upon becoming a law.

#### **C. Government Sector Impact:**

The Department of Transportation will incur cost of approximately \$4,500 (from the State Transportation Trust Fund) for erecting markers for the designations. This is based

on the assumption that two markers will be erected for each of the 15 designations at a cost of maintaining these signs over time, and for future replacement of the signs as necessary.

**VII. Amendments:**

#1 by Transportation:

- Designates a portion of 22<sup>nd</sup> Street in the city of Miami in Miami-Dade County as the "Enrique Valledor Way."
- That portion of I-275 which begins at the Pinellas County end of the Howard Franklin Bridge and, proceeding south, ends at the beginning of the Sunshine Skyway Bridge is designated as the "St. Petersburg Parkway."
- Northwest 87<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Miami-Dade County from N.W. 41<sup>st</sup> Street to N.W. 52<sup>nd</sup> Street is designated "Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Special Agent Ariel Rios Memorial Way"
- Northwest 87<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Miami-Dade County from N.W. 52<sup>nd</sup> Street to N.W. 58<sup>th</sup> Street is designated Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Special "Agent Eddie Benitez Memorial Way"
- State Road 580 within the city limits of Temple Terrace, from the intersection of Busch Boulevard and Overlook Drive through 56<sup>th</sup> Street, is renamed "Temple Terrace Parkway."
- State Road 50 from Ocoee to State Road 436 in Orange County is designated as "Martin L. King, Jr., Drive."
- U.S. 1, between S.W. 216<sup>th</sup> Street and S.W. 232<sup>nd</sup> Street in Miami-Dade County is designated as "Judge Steve Levine Boulevard."
- A portion of State Road 19 in Lake County from the north end of Lake County to the intersection of State Road 19 and Highway 441 in Eustis is designated the "Private Robert M. McTureous, Jr., U.S.M.C., Medal of Honor Memorial Highway."
- A portion of U.S. 1, between S.W. 136<sup>th</sup> Street and S.W. 186<sup>th</sup> Street in Miami-Dade County is designated "Steven Cranman Boulevard."
- A portion of S.W. 186<sup>th</sup> Street between U.S. 1 and S.W. 107<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Miami-Dade County is designated Ethel Beckford Boulevard."
- A portion of State Road 5 (U.S. 1) between S.W. 312<sup>th</sup> Street and S.W. 328<sup>th</sup> Street in Miami-Dade County is designated as "Phicol Williams Boulevard."
- A portion of S. W. 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue from U.S. 1 to S.W. 230<sup>th</sup> Street in Miami-Dade County is designated as "Arthur Mays Boulevard."

- State Road 934 on N.W. 79<sup>th</sup> Street in Miami-Dade County, from the west boundary of State House District 108 to the east boundary of district 108 is designated as “Jean-Jacques Dessalines Boulevard.”
- State Road 922 on N.W. 125<sup>th</sup> Street in Miami-Dade County from N.W. 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue to Griffin Boulevard is designated “Toussaint L’Ouverture Boulevard.”
- State Road 915 on N.E. 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Miami-Dade County from the north boundary of State House District 108 to U.S. 1, is designated “Frederick Douglass Boulevard.”
- A portion of S. W. 24<sup>th</sup> Street (Coral Way) between 25<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 28<sup>th</sup> Avenue in Miami-Dade County is designated “Dr. Luis Conte-Aguero Way.”
- A portion of S. W. 8<sup>th</sup> Street between 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 32<sup>nd</sup> Avenue in Miami-Dade County is designated “Olga Choren and Tony Alvarez Way.”
- The Skypass Bridge (number 930470) in the City of Riviera Beach in Palm Beach County is designated as “L. E. Buie Bridge.”
- A portion of North 36<sup>th</sup> Street (State Road 25) from Biscayne Boulevard to N.W. 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue is designated “Borinquen Boulevard.”
- Designating State Road 922 (96<sup>th</sup> Street) that provides entry and exit into the Bal Harbour Shops as “Stanley Whitman Boulevard.”
- Designating Miami Gardens Drive from U.S. 1 to 441 as the “Ronald A. Silver Boulevard.”
- U.S. 1 from 57<sup>th</sup> Avenue to S.W. 80<sup>th</sup> Street in Miami-Dade County is designated as “South Miami All-American Way.”
- Designating a portion of Golfair Boulevard from I-95 to Moncrief Road in Jacksonville as the “Holzendorf Boulevard.”
- The new U.S. Highway 27 bridge in the city of Moore Haven in Glades County is designated the “Mamie Langdale Memorial Bridge.”

  - Designating SR 50 from U.S. 75 to U.S. 19 in Hernando County as "Senator Ginny Brown-Waite Highway."
