- Bright Futures Scholarship award in the 1997-1998, 1998-1999, 1999-2000, 2000-2001, or 2001-2002 school year, and who enrolled as a student in a United States military service academy, shall retroactively receive the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship award amounts calculated pursuant to subsection (1) for each year the student was eligible.

  Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 240.40202, students shall be eligible for the retroactive receipt of this award by applying to the Florida Department of Education by July 1, 2003.
- (b) Upon verification by the Florida Department of Education that a student was enrolled for any of the years listed in paragraph (a) in a United States military service academy and met the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship eligibility requirements for receipt of an award, the Comptroller shall issue an individual warrant made payable to the student and mailed by the Florida Department of Education to the student.
