Subsection (1) of section 40.011, Florida 24 Statutes, is amended to read: 25 40.011 Jury lists.--26 (1) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor 27 Vehicles shall deliver monthly to the clerk of the circuit 28 court in each county a list of names of persons who reside in 29 that county, who are citizens of the United States, who are legal residents of Florida, and who are 18 years of age or 30 older. On or before January 1, 1993, and each year thereafter 31

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by January 1, the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles shall deliver to the clerk of the circuit court in each county a list of names, along with mailing addresses and dates of birth, of each person 18 years of age or older whose name appears in the department database and whose address is in that county. By January 1, 1992, the department shall begin the process of identifying persons whose names appear in the department database who are not citizens of the United States and legal residents of this state for the purpose of jury selection. By January 1, 1998, the department database list delivered to the clerk of the circuit court in each county may include only the names of persons who are citizens of the United States and legal residents of Florida and whose address is in that county and who are 18 years of age or older. The clerk of the circuit court shall add to the list the name of any person who is 18 years of age or older and who is a citizen of the United States and a legal resident of Florida and who indicates a desire to serve as a juror, but whose name does not appear on the department database list, by requiring such person to execute an affidavit at the office of the clerk.

Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 322.051, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

322.051 Identification cards.--

- (1) Any person who is 12 years of age or older, or any person who has a disability, regardless of age, who applies for a disabled parking permit under s. 320.0848, may be issued an identification card by the department upon completion of an application and payment of an application fee.
- (a) Each such application shall include the following 31 information regarding the applicant:

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- Full name (first, middle or maiden, and last), gender, social security card number, county of residence and mailing address, and a brief description.
 - 2. Proof of birth date satisfactory to the department.
- 3. Proof of identity satisfactory to the department. Such proof must include one of the following unless a driver's license record or identification card record has already been established: a certified copy of a United States birth certificate, a valid United States passport, an alien registration receipt card (green card), an employment authorization card issued by the United States Department of Justice, or proof of nonimmigrant classification provided by the United States Department of Justice, for an original identification card.
- (b) An application for an identification card must be signed and verified by the applicant in a format designated by the department before a person authorized to administer oaths. The fee for an identification card is \$3, including payment for the color photograph or digital image of the applicant.
- Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 322.08, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
 - 322.08 Application for license.--
- (2) Each such application shall include the following information regarding the applicant:
- (a) Full name (first, middle or maiden, and last), gender, social security card number, county of residence and mailing address, and a brief description.
- (b) Proof of birth date satisfactory to the department.
- (c) Proof of identity satisfactory to the department. 31 | Such proof must include one of the following unless a driver's

license record or identification card record has already been established: a certified copy of a United States birth certificate, a valid United States passport, an alien registration receipt card (green card), an employment authorization card issued by the United States Department of Justice, or proof of nonimmigrant classification provided by the United States Department of Justice, for an original license.

(d) Whether the applicant has previously been licensed to drive, and, if so, when and by what state, and whether any such license or driving privilege has ever been disqualified, revoked, or suspended, or whether an application has ever been refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such disqualification, suspension, revocation, or refusal.

Section 4. Subsection (2) of section 322.17, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

322.17 Duplicate and replacement certificates.--

(2) Upon the surrender of the original license and the payment of any applicable a \$10 replacement fee, the department shall issue a replacement license to make a change in name, address, or restrictions. Upon written request by the licensee and notification of a change in address, and the payment of any applicable replacement a \$10 fee, the department shall issue an address sticker which shall be affixed to the back of the license by the licensee. A \$10 replacement fee shall be assessed for a replacement license that is issued to make a change in restrictions. No fee is to be assessed for a replacement license that is issued to make a change in name or address if the licensee makes the change within 20 calendar days after the change in name or address as required by s. 322.19. A \$10 replacement fee shall be assessed

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for a replacement license that is issued to make a change in name or address when the licensee makes the change within 21 to 30 calendar days after the change in name or address, and a \$20 replacement fee shall be assessed for a replacement license that is issued to make a change in name or address when the licensee makes the change later than 30 calendar days after the change in name or address. Nine dollars of the fee levied in this subsection shall go to the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund of the department.

Section 5. Section 322.19, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

322.19 Change of address or name. --

- (1) Whenever any person, after applying for or receiving a driver's license, changes his or her legal name, that person must within 20 calendar 10 days thereafter obtain a replacement license that reflects the change.
- (2) Whenever any person, after applying for or receiving a driver's license, changes his or her the residence or mailing address in the application or license, that the person must, within 20 10 calendar days, either obtain a replacement license that reflects the change or request in writing a change-of-address sticker. The written request to the department must include the old and new addresses and the driver's license number.
- (3) A violation of this section is a nonmoving violation with a penalty as provided in s. 318.18(2).

Section 6. Subsection (3) of section 322.121, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

322.121 Periodic reexamination of all drivers.--

(3) For each licensee whose driving record does not 31 show any revocations, disqualifications, or suspensions for

the preceding 7 years or any convictions for the preceding 3 years except for convictions of the following nonmoving 3 violations: (a) Failure to exhibit a vehicle registration 4 5 certificate, rental agreement, or cab card pursuant to s. 6 320.0605; 7 (b) Failure to renew a motor vehicle or mobile home 8 registration that has been expired for 4 months or less 9 pursuant to s. 320.07(3)(a); 10 (c) Operating a motor vehicle with an expired license 11 that has been expired for 4 months or less pursuant to s. 322.065; 12 13 (d) Failure to carry or exhibit a license pursuant to 14 s. 322.15(1); or (e) Failure to notify the department of a change of 15 address or name within 20 calendar $\frac{10}{10}$ days pursuant to s. 16 17 322.19, 18 19 the department shall cause such licensee's license to be 20 prominently marked with the notation "Safe Driver."
