An act relating to public records; amending s. 717.117, F.S.; providing an exemption from public-records requirements for social security numbers and financial account numbers contained in unclaimed property reports held by the Department of Banking and Finance; providing exceptions to the exemption; providing for future review and repeal; providing a statement of public necessity; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (8) is added to section 717.117, Florida Statutes, to read:

717.117 Report of unclaimed property.--

numbers contained in reports required under this section, held by the Department of Banking and Finance, are confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. Notwithstanding this exemption, social security numbers shall be released for the limited purpose of locating owners of abandoned or unclaimed property to an attorney, Florida-certified public accountant, private investigator who is duly licensed in this state, or a private investigative agency licensed under chapter 493 and registered with the Department of Banking and Finance under chapter 717. This

subsection is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed

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1 October 2, 2007, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 2 3 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to make confidential and exempt social security 4 5 numbers and financial account numbers of apparent owners of 6 abandoned or unclaimed property which are in the custody of 7 the Department of Banking and Finance to prevent identity 8 theft and related crimes. The Legislature further finds that this exemption is necessary to prevent the use of such 9 10 information in forged documents demonstrating entitlement to 11 abandoned or unclaimed property and thereby defrauding the rightful property owner or the State School Fund. 12 Notwithstanding the public necessity to make confidential such 13 information, it is necessary to provide access to social 14 security numbers to an attorney, Florida-certified public 15 accountant, private investigator duly licensed in this state, 16 17 or private investigative agencies that are licensed under chapter 493, Florida Statutes, and registered with the 18 19 Department of Banking and Finance to facilitate the location and return of unclaimed property to rightful owners. The 20 Legislature further finds that attorneys, Florida-certified 21 public accountants, private investigators, and private 22 investigative agencies are subject to more stringent 23 24 regulation and oversight than the public as a whole. In 25 addition, such professionals are the only persons authorized to file claims on behalf of apparent owners of abandoned or 26 unclaimed property pursuant to chapter 717, Florida Statutes. 27 28 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 29 law. 30

Senate Bill 468  Limits the release of the confidential and exempt information to a private investigated agency that is licensed under chapter 493, F.S., and registered with the Department of Banking and Finance under chapter 717, F.S.  Eliminates the provision that reiterated that private investigative agencies would continue to receive information required under s. 717.118, F.S.
