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Section 17. Effective July 1, 2002, section 232.4255, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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232.4255 Physical assessments for high school athletes.--Prior to participation each year, each student who participates in organized high school athletics must receive a complete physical assessment. The assessment must be performed by a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 and must include a complete cardiovascular assessment, including, but not limited to, an electrocardiogram. The electrocardiogram must be analyzed by a person who is licensed or trained as a specialist in electrocardiogram analysis. It shall be the responsibility of the student to pay the costs of such physical assessment with the exception of a student enrolled in the Florida Kidcare program or Medicaid, in which

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1 case costs shall be covered by the program.
