315-1228-02 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to land surveying and mapping; 3 amending s. 472.003, F.S.; providing additional exemptions from regulation; amending s. 4 5 472.005, F.S.; providing additional definitions; amending s. 472.008, F.S.; б 7 requiring the Board of Professional Surveyors 8 and Mappers to adopt rules governing the use of professional titles by retired surveyors and 9 mappers; amending s. 472.013, F.S.; eliminating 10 11 obsolete provisions; eliminating provisions relating to the approval of training provided 12 13 by the United States Government; amending s. 14 472.015, F.S.; revising work-experience 15 requirements for licensure by endorsement; 16 amending s. 472.029, F.S.; revising provisions 17 authorizing surveyors and mappers to enter 18 lands of third parties; providing liability standards for such entries; amending s. 19 20 472.031, F.S.; prohibiting persons who are not registered to practice surveying and mapping 21 22 from offering to practice such profession or 23 from using certain related professional titles; 24 amending s. 472.033, F.S.; providing as grounds 25 for discipline a plea of nolo contendere to 26 certain crimes; eliminating board authority to 27 specify which acts constitute violations; 28 eliminating a requirement for reissuance of 29 certain licenses upon board certification; providing an effective date. 30

For the purposes of this statute, a 2 3 surveyor and mapper means a person who determines and displays 4 the facts of size, shape, topography, tidal datum planes, 5 legal or geodetic location or relation, and orientation of 6 improved or unimproved real property through direct 7 measurement or from certifiable measurement through accepted 8 photogrammetric procedures.

9 (4)(a) "Practice of surveying and mapping" means, 10 among other things, any professional service or work, the 11 adequate performance of which involves the application of special knowledge of the principles of mathematics, the 12 related physical and applied sciences, and the relevant 13 requirements of law for adequate evidence of the act of 14 15 measuring, locating, establishing, or reestablishing lines, angles, elevations, natural and manmade features in the air, 16 17 on the surface and immediate subsurface of the earth, within underground workings, and on the beds or surface of bodies of 18 19 water, for the purpose of determining, establishing, 20 describing, displaying, or interpreting the facts of size, shape, topography, tidal datum planes, legal or geodetic 21 location or relocation, and orientation of improved or 22 23 unimproved real property and appurtenances thereto, including 24 acreage and condominiums.

(b) The practice of surveying and mapping also includes, but is not limited to, photogrammetric control; the monumentation and remonumentation of property boundaries and subdivisions; the measurement of and preparation of plans showing existing improvements after construction; the layout of proposed improvements; the preparation of descriptions for use in legal instruments of conveyance of real property and

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1 property rights; the preparation of subdivision planning maps 2 and record plats, as provided for in chapter 177; the 3 determination of, but not the design of, grades and elevations of roads and land in connection with subdivisions or divisions 4 5 of land; and the creation and perpetuation of alignments 6 related to maps, record plats, field note records, reports, 7 property descriptions, and plans and drawings that represent 8 them.

9 (5) The term "Surveyor and mapper intern" includes the 10 term "surveyor-mapper-in-training" and means a person who 11 complies with the requirements provided by ss. 472.001-472.037 12 and who has passed an examination as provided by rules adopted 13 by the board.

14 (6) The term "Responsible charge" means direct control
15 and personal supervision of surveying and mapping work, but
16 does not include experience as a chainperson, rodperson,
17 instrumentperson, ordinary draftsperson, digitizer, scriber,
18 photo lab technician, ordinary stereo plotter operator, aerial
19 photo pilot, photo interpreter, and other positions of routine
20 work.

21 (7) The term "License" means the registration of 22 surveyors and mappers or the certification of businesses to 23 practice surveying and mapping in this state.

(8) "Photogrammetric mapper" means any person who
engages in the practice of surveying and mapping using aerial
or terrestrial photography or other sources of images.

27 <u>(9) "Employee" means a person who receives</u>
28 <u>compensation from and is under the supervision and control of</u>
29 <u>an employer who regularly deducts the F.I.C.A. and withholding</u>

30 <u>tax and provides workers' compensation, as prescribed by law.</u>

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1	(10) "Subordinate" means an employee who performs work
2	under the direction, supervision, and responsible charge of a
3	person who is registered under this chapter.
4	(11) "Monument" means an artificial or natural object
5	that is permanent or semipermanent and used or presumed to
6	occupy a real property corner, a point on a boundary line, or
7	a reference point or other point used for horizontal or
8	vertical control.
9	(12) "Legal entity" means a corporation, partnership,
10	association, or person practicing under a fictitious name who

28	(2) An applicant shall be entitled to take the
29	licensure examination to practice in this state as a surveyor
30	and mapper if the applicant is of good moral character and has
31	satisfied one of the following requirements:
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1 (a) The applicant is a graduate of an approved course 2 of study in surveying and mapping from a college or university 3 recognized by the board and has a specific experience record 4 of 4 or more years as a subordinate to a professional surveyor 5 and mapper in the active practice of surveying and mapping, 6 which experience is of a nature indicating that the applicant was in responsible charge of the accuracy and correctness of 7 8 the surveying and mapping work performed. The course of study 9 in surveying and mapping must have included not fewer than 32 10 semester hours of study, or its academic equivalent, in the 11 science of surveying and mapping or in board-approved surveying-and-mapping-related courses. Work experience 12 13 acquired as a part of the education requirement shall not be construed as experience in responsible charge. 14 (b) The applicant is a graduate of a 4-year course of 15 study, other than in surveying and mapping, at an accredited 16 17 college or university and has a specific experience record of 18 6 or more years as a subordinate to a registered surveyor and 19 mapper in the active practice of surveying and mapping, 5 years of which shall be of a nature indicating that the 20 21 applicant was in responsible charge of the accuracy and correctness of the surveying and mapping work performed. The 22 course of study in disciplines other than surveying and 23 24 mapping must have included not fewer than 32 semester hours of study or its academic equivalent, 25 semester hours of which 25 shall be in surveying and mapping subjects or in any 26 27 combination of courses in civil engineering, surveying,

28 mapping, mathematics, photogrammetry, forestry, or land law

29 and the physical sciences. Work experience acquired as a part

30 of the education requirement shall not be construed as

31 experience in responsible charge.

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1	(c) The applicant was enrolled, on October 1, 1988, in
2	a 4-year course of study in surveying and mapping at a college
3	or university recognized by the board and prior to October 1,
4	<del>1991, and both completes at least 32 semester hours, or the</del>
5	academic equivalent, in surveying-and-mapping-related courses
6	and has a specific experience record of 6 or more years as a
7	subordinate to a surveyor and mapper, 5 years of which are in
8	the active practice of surveying and mapping of a nature
9	indicating that the applicant was in responsible charge of the
10	accuracy and correctness of surveying and mapping work
11	performed.
12	(4) The board shall adopt rules providing for the
13	review and approval of schools and colleges <del>, including</del>
14	military schools and training and apprenticeship programs
15	<del>operated by the United States Government,</del> and the courses of
16	study in surveying and mapping in such schools <u>and</u> -colleges-
17	<del>and programs</del> . The rules <u>must</u> <del>shall</del> be based on the educational
18	requirements for surveying and mapping as defined in s.

20	acceptance of the approval and accreditation of schools and

27	by endorsement an applicant who:

30	territory Qualifies to take the examination as set forth in s.
31	472.013, who has passed a national, regional, state, or
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1 territorial licensing examination that is substantially 2 equivalent to the examination required by s. 472.013, and who 3 has 8 or more years' work experience as a subordinate to a registered surveyor and mapper in the active practice of 4 5 surveying and mapping, 6 years of which must involve work that б shows that the applicant was in responsible charge of the 7 accuracy and correctness of the surveying and mapping work 8 performed satisfied the experience requirements set forth in <del>s. 472.013</del>; or 9 10 (b) Holds a valid license to practice surveying and 11 mapping issued by another state or territory of the United States if the criteria for issuance of the license were 12 substantially the same as the licensure criteria that existed 13 in Florida at the time the license was issued. 14 15 All applicants for licensure by endorsement must pass an 16 17 examination on Florida laws and rules before licensure. Section 472.029, Florida Statutes, is 18 19 amended to read: 20 472.029 Surveyors and mappers authorized to enter 21 lands of third parties under certain conditions.--Surveyors 22 and mappers or their subordinates may go on, over, and upon the lands of others when necessary to make surveys and maps or 23 24 locate or set monuments, and, in so doing, may carry with them 25 their agents and employees necessary for that purpose. Entry under the right hereby granted by this section does not 26 27 constitute trespass, and surveyors and mappers and their duly 28 authorized agents or employees who enter in compliance with 29 all federal, state, and local regulations pertaining to 30 premises security, agricultural protections, and other health 31 and safety requirements so entering are not liable to arrest

(4) The department shall reissue the license of a disciplined surveyor and mapper upon certification by the board that he or she has complied with all of the terms and conditions set forth in the final order.
