Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 13 112.533, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 112.533 Receipt and processing of complaints.--15 (2)(a) A complaint filed against a law enforcement 16 officer or correctional officer with a law enforcement agency 17 or correctional agency and all information obtained pursuant 18 to the investigation by the agency of such complaint shall be 19 confidential and exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) 20 until the investigation ceases to be active, or until the agency head or the agency head's designee provides written 21 notice to the officer who is the subject of the complaint, 22 23 either personally or by mail, that the agency has either: 1. Concluded the investigation with a finding not to 24 25 proceed with disciplinary action or to file charges; or 26 2. Concluded the investigation with a finding to 27 proceed with disciplinary action or to file charges. 28 29 Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, the officer who is 30 the subject of the complaint, along with legal counsel or any

other representative of his or her choice, may review the

complaint and all statements regardless of form made by the complainant and witnesses immediately prior to the beginning of the investigative interview. If a witness to a complaint is incarcerated in a correctional facility and may be under the supervision of, or have contact with, the officer under investigation, only the names and written statements of the complainant and nonincarcerated witnesses may be reviewed by the officer under investigation immediately prior to the beginning of the investigative interview.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.

SENATE SUMMARY

Authorizes legal counsel for a law enforcement officer or a correctional officer and a representative of the officer's choice to review a complaint filed against the officer and to review statements made by the complainant and witnesses.
