An act relating to class size; amending s. 236.687, F.S.; revising priorities for the use of funds for class size reduction; providing funds for the construction of primary learning centers; defining the term "primary learning center"; requiring that funds received for class size reduction be returned to the Department of Education under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 236.687, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
236.687 Maximum class size goals.--It shall be the goal of the Legislature and each school district that each elementary school in the school district beginning with kindergarten through grade 3 three class sizes not exceed 20 students, with a ratio of one full-time equivalent teacher per 20 students; except that only in the case of the 100 lowest performing efitically low-performing schools in the state, as identified by the Commissioner of Education, the goal in kindergarten through grade 3 three shall be a ratio of one full-time equivalent teacher per 15 students. For purposes of any Funding provided in the General Appropriations Act to meet these goals shall be utilized to reduce class size in the following order of priority:-
(1) First the district shall give priority shall be given to identified critically low-performing schools for the construction of primary learning centers in the district. As

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used in this section, the term "primary learning center" shall
mean a stand-alone wing of kindergarten through grade 3
classrooms, each of which is equipped with a restroom and can
accommodate a teacher and a maximum of 20 students.
    (2) Second priority for the use of any funds
designated for meeting these goals shall be given to the 100
lowest performing schools in the state, as identified by the
commissioner.
    (3) Third priority shall be given to for kindergarten
through grade 1 one.
    (4) Fourth Third priority for the use of any funds
designated for meeting these goals shall be given to for
grades 2 two and \underline{3 three.}
Any district receiving funds pursuant to this section shall
maintain class sizes in kindergarten through grade 3 in
participating schools at or below the intended goal for at
least 3 years after such space is occupied, or refund any
funds received pursuant to this section to the Department of
Education.
            Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
