Section 232.2464, Florida Statutes, is 18 19 created to read: 20 232.2464 Students with disabilities; graduation 21 requirements. --2.2 (1) For purposes of this section, "student with disabilities" means any student with mental retardation, 23 24 hearing impairments including deafness, speech or language 25 impairments, visual impairments including blindness, serious emotional disturbance, orthopedic impairments, autism, 26 27 traumatic brain injury, other health impairments, or specific learning disabilities including, but not limited to, dyslexia, 28 29 dyscalculia, and aphasia, or any student who is hospitalized 30 or homebound. 31

- (2) A student with disabilities shall be eligible for accommodations in taking the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) or the High School Competency Test (HSCT) if such accommodations are allowed in the classrooms or for testing. Accommodations shall be considered allowable, valid, and scoreable if they are used during classroom instruction or assessment and are identified in the student's Individual Education Plan or 504 Plan. A student who receives accommodations pursuant to this subsection is eligible for a standard high school diploma upon successful completion of coursework required for graduation.
- severe that it would be a major barrier to earning passing scores on the FCAT or the HSCT shall be exempt from taking the FCAT or the HSCT if such exemption is identified in the student's Individual Education Plan or 504 Plan. A student who receives an exemption pursuant to this subsection is eligible for a standard high school diploma upon successful completion of coursework required for graduation and demonstration of competency through alternative assessment based on the standards used for the FCAT or the HSCT.
- (4) A student with disabilities shall be eligible for reasonable substitution of coursework for any requirement for high school graduation and shall be eligible for a standard high school diploma if:
- (a) Documentation is provided that the student's inability to meet the graduation requirement is related to the student's disability.
- (b) Failure to meet the graduation requirement does not constitute a fundamental alteration in the nature of the student's high school program of study.

(5) The Individual Education Plan team or 504 Plan team and the parents of a student shall be responsible for identifying the accommodations or exemption for a student with disabilities for coursework and assessment, including statewide assessment, based on compliance standards of the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and s. 228.041(18). (6) The Florida Board of Education shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section and shall develop substitute requirements for high school graduation where appropriate. (7) The Department of Education shall provide sufficient funding to enable each school district to provide appropriate accommodations for statewide assessment for all students with disabilities. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
