Paragraph (ee) of subsection (3) of section 15 16 119.07, Florida Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 17 2001-364, Laws of Florida, is created to read: 18 119.07 Inspection, examination, and duplication of 19 records; exemptions. --20 (3) (ee) Building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, 21 2.2 and diagrams, including draft, preliminary, and final formats, 23 which depict the internal layout and structural elements of a 24 building, arena, stadium, water treatment facility, or other 25 structure owned or operated by an agency as defined in s. 26 119.011 are exempt from the provisions of subsection (1) and 27 s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This exemption 28 applies to building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, and 29 diagrams, including draft, preliminary, and final formats, which depict the internal layout and structural elements of a 30 31 building, arena, stadium, water treatment facility, or other

structure owned or operated by an agency before, on, or after the effective date of this act. Information made exempt by 2 this paragraph may be disclosed to another governmental entity 3 if disclosure is necessary for the receiving entity to perform 4 5 its duties and responsibilities; to a licensed architect, 6 engineer, or contractor who is performing work on or related 7 to the building, arena, stadium, water treatment facility, or 8 other structure owned or operated by an agency; or upon a 9 showing of good cause before a court of competent 10 jurisdiction. The entities or persons receiving such information shall maintain the exempt status of the 11 12 information. This paragraph is subject to the Open Government 13 Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and 14 shall stand repealed on October 2, 2007, unless reviewed and reenacted by the Legislature. 15 16 Section 2. The Legislature finds that the public records exemption created by this act is a public necessity in 17 order to ensure the safety of government infrastructures and 18 19 to ensure public safety. Such exempt information is a vital 20 component of public safety and if it were made publicly available, the ability of persons who desire to harm 21 22 individuals located in or using those structures, the building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, and diagrams of which 23 are made exempt by this act, would be increased. In addition, 24 terrorists would have easy access to the exempt information 25 26 and use the information to inflict harm on the public. 27 Although skill would be required to use such information to 28 further an act of terrorism, ample evidence exists of the capabilities of terrorists to conduct complicated acts of 29 terrorism. The September 11, 2001, attack on the World Trade 30

anthrax in this country and state, provides evidence that such capabilities exist. These events also show the crippling effect that terrorist acts can have, not only on the lives of persons in a community affected by terrorist acts but also on the economy of the community, the state, and the nation. Consequently, the Legislature finds that the public records exemption created by this act is a public necessity. Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
