Subsection (1) of section 39.201, Florida 23 Statutes, is amended to read: 24 39.201 Mandatory reports of child abuse, abandonment, 25 or neglect; mandatory reports of death; central abuse 26 hotline.--27 (1) Any person, including, but not limited to, any: 28 Physician, osteopathic physician, medical (a) 29 examiner, chiropractic physician, nurse, or hospital personnel engaged in the admission, examination, care, or treatment of 30 31 persons;

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1 Health or mental health professional other than (b) 2 one listed in paragraph (a); 3 (c) Practitioner who relies solely on spiritual means 4 for healing; 5 (d) School teacher or other school official or 6 personnel; 7 (e) Social worker, day care center worker, or other 8 professional child care, foster care, residential, or 9 institutional worker; 10 (f) Law enforcement officer; or 11 (q) Judge, 12 13 who knows, or has reasonable cause to suspect, that a child is 14 abused, abandoned, or neglected by a parent, legal custodian, 15 caregiver, or other person responsible for the child's welfare 16 shall report such knowledge or suspicion to the department in 17 the manner prescribed in subsection (2). 18 Section 2.
