On page 24, between lines 28 and 29,

insert:

Section 8. Subsection (14) is added to section 403.708, Florida Statutes, to read:

403.708 Prohibition; penalty.--

(14)(a) Discarded wood treated with chromated copper arsenate shall not be disposed of in an unlined landfill or by open burning, and shall not be used in the production of mulch or compost, after July 1, 2003. However, this prohibition shall not apply in those cases where the department determines that it is impracticable to separate small amounts of wood treated with chromated copper arsenate from the waste stream. No later than January 1, 2003, the department shall initiate rulemaking to establish criteria for implementing the provisions of this paragraph.

(b) The department shall conduct a study of the expected impacts to public health and the environment from the

1 controlled burning of wood treated with chromated copper  
 2 arsenate, and of the management of ash from such burning. The  
 3 department is authorized to adopt rules to address any such
