contagious but largely preventable infection of the spinal 1 2 cord fluid and the fluid that surrounds the brain, and 3 WHEREAS, one in 10 cases of meningococcal meningitis is 4 fatal, and 5 WHEREAS, one in seven survivors is left with a severe 6 handicap, such as loss of a limb, mental retardation, 7 paralysis, deafness, or seizures, and 8 WHEREAS, individuals of any age can carry the disease 9 for days, weeks, or months unknowingly or without becoming 10 ill, and WHEREAS, at any time, from 10 to 25 percent of the 11 12 population carries meningococcal meningitis, and 13 WHEREAS, scientific evidence suggests that college students living in dormitory facilities are six times more 14 15 likely than other individuals to contract meningococcal meningitis, and 16 17 WHEREAS, immunization against meningococcal meningitis 18 will decrease the risk of disease, and 19 WHEREAS, the Legislature recommends that college 20 freshmen residing in on-campus housing should be vaccinated against meningococcal meningitis, NOW, THEREFORE, 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 3
