WHEREAS, founded in 1948 in Daytona Beach, Florida, by the late William "Big Bill" France, with his wife, Anne B., the National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing is the result of an effort to organize a patchwork of stock car racing groups across the Southeast, and, because of the dedication of this determined couple and their Florida family, NASCAR, headquartered in Florida, is now the most successful motorsports sanctioning body in the United States, and

WHEREAS, from its humble beginnings more than 50 years ago, NASCAR is now comprised of 12 different racing series nationwide, with the DAYTONA 500, "The Great American Race," widely regarded as one of the world's most prestigious automobile racing events, often referred to as the "Super Bowl of stock car racing"; and Speedweeks has become the state's largest annually attended sporting event, with spectators exceeding a half million at Daytona International Speedway and numbering more than 30 million in national and worldwide television audiences, and
