House Resolution

A resolution recognizing the late Ralph Maltsby and Ed Duffee.

WHEREAS, in 1962, then Secretary of State Tom Adams made a decision that would change the face of government in Florida, and

WHEREAS, at that time, Secretary Adams issued a directive from his office in the Old Capitol, and Ralph Maltsby, now deceased, became the first African American to be employed in Florida's capitol, and

WHEREAS, shortly afterward, Ed Duffee took his place as the second African American state capitol employee, and a giant stride was taken toward establishing diversity in the government of Florida, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the late Mr. Maltsby and Mr. Duffee be recognized for their place in the history of the State of Florida, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the House of Representatives pauses in its deliberations to pay tribute to the memory of the late Ralph Maltsby and to Ed Duffee as the first and second African Americans to be employed to work in the halls of Florida's state capitol.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be presented to Mr. Ed Duffee as a tangible token of the sentiments expressed herein.
