An act relating to mandated health benefit coverages; requiring the Office of Legislative Services to contract for completion of a report on proposed mandated health coverages; specifying report review requirements; requiring a report to the Legislature; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. (1) Using a portion of the funds made available in Specific Appropriation 2556 in the General Appropriations Act for fiscal year 2001-2002, the Office of Legislative Services in coordination with the Agency for Health Care Administration shall contract for the completion of a report assessing the impact of the following proposed mandated health benefit coverages:

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(a) Substance abuse.

- (e) Occupational Therapy.
- (f) Expansion of the current mandate for the off-label use of FDA-approved pharmaceuticals for the treatment of life-threatening, chronic, or disabling conditions.
 - (2) Such review shall include:
- (a) Those elements for review as specified in s.
 624.215(2), Florida Statutes, relating to proposals for
 legislation which would mandate health benefit coverage and
 review by the Legislature, to what extent the mandated health
 benefit coverage is part of self-insured plans offered in this
 state or federally funded programs such as those offered to
 employees of the United States Postal Service and employees of
 the Federal Government, to what extent such mandated health
 benefit coverages are available as part of large group plans
 versus small group plans, and recent state and federal court
 and administrative rulings regarding such issues.
- (b) The nature of those services being used by those insured persons who currently have a health coverage benefit, including what is included in such coverage, the conditions for which coverage is included, the extent to which such covered persons reach any applicable annual or lifetime benefit cap, utilization and authorization guidelines applicable to such coverage, and inclusion of treatment medications and guidelines applicable to medication coverage.
- (3) All insurers, as defined in s. 624.03, doing business in this state, shall provide data requested in order to complete this review.

1	(4) The report shall include information from persons
2	or organizations proposing mandated health benefit coverages,
