This legislation terminates and re-creates the Excellent Teaching Program Trust Fund, effective July 1, 2002. The Excellent Teaching Program Trust Fund, FLAIR #48-2-206, is administered by the Department of Education. This fund was created by Chapter 98-210.

The re-creation of the Excellent Teaching Program Trust Fund would provide for receipt of funding for the operation of the Excellent Teaching Program.
