Subsection (2) of section 97.052, Florida 11 Statutes, is amended to read: 12 97.052 Uniform statewide voter registration 13 application.--(2) The uniform statewide voter registration 14 15 application must be designed to elicit the following information from the applicant: 16 17 (a) Full name. (b) Date of birth. 18 (c) Address of legal residence. 19 20 (d) Mailing address, if different. 21 (e) County of legal residence. 22 (f) Address of property for which the applicant has 23 been granted a homestead exemption, if any. 24 (g) Race or ethnicity that best describes the applicant: 25 26 1. American Indian or Alaskan Native. 2. Asian or Pacific Islander. 27 3. Black, not Hispanic. 28 29 4. White, not Hispanic. 5. Hispanic. 30 31 (h) State or country of birth. 1

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1 (i)<del>(h)</del> Sex. 2 (j)<del>(i)</del> Party affiliation. 3 (k) (j) Whether the applicant needs assistance in 4 voting. 5 (1)(k) Name and address where last registered. б (m) (m) (1) Last four digits of the applicant's social 7 security number. (n) (m) Florida driver's license number or the 8 9 identification number from a Florida identification card issued under s. 322.051. 10 11 (o)(n) Telephone number (optional). (p)(o) Signature of applicant under penalty for false 12 swearing pursuant to s. 104.011, by which the person 13 14 subscribes to the oath required by s. 3, Art. VI of the State Constitution and s. 97.051, and swears or affirms that the 15 information contained in the registration application is true. 16 17 (q) (p) Whether the application is being used for initial registration, to update a voter registration record, 18 19 or to request a replacement registration identification card. 20 (r) (q) Whether the applicant is a citizen of the United States. 21 22 (s) (r) That the applicant has not been convicted of a felony or, if convicted, has had his or her civil rights 23 24 restored. 25 (t) (t) (s) That the applicant has not been adjudicated mentally incapacitated with respect to voting or, if so 26 adjudicated, has had his or her right to vote restored. 27 28 29 The registration form must be in plain language and designed so that convicted felons whose civil rights have been restored 30 31 and persons who have been adjudicated mentally incapacitated 2

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and have had their voting rights restored are not required to reveal their prior conviction or adjudication. Section 2.
