## Florida House of Representatives - 2002 By Representative Richardson

A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to tax on sales, use, and other transactions; amending s. 212.055, F.S.; 3 authorizing district school boards to levy a 4 discretionary public school surtax; requiring a 5 referendum; providing for use of the proceeds; 6 7 providing an effective date. 8 9 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that caring and 10 qualified public school teachers play a critical role in 11 preparing children and young adults for success in higher education and in the workplace, and 12 WHEREAS, the Legislature further recognizes that 13 14 Florida's average teacher salary is \$5,000 below the national average, and that teacher salaries in the state are not 15 16 sufficient to recruit and retain the caring and qualified 17 teachers we need, and WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the cost of 18 19 providing teachers with medical care and prescription drug coverage has risen dramatically, forcing school districts to 20 21 increase contributions to health insurance in lieu of 2.2 increasing teacher salaries, and WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that school 23 24 districts have many localized needs, such as escalating operating costs for utilities and transportation, class size 25 26 reduction, and teacher development, which are straining 27 already tight district budgets, and 28 WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Legislature to assist 29 school districts by authorizing an optional local surtax to 30 provide funding for more competitive teacher salaries, 31 1

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1 adequate employee health care coverage, and escalating 2 operating costs, NOW, THEREFORE, 3 4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 5 6 Section 1. Subsection (8) is added to section 212.055, 7 Florida Statutes, to read: 8 212.055 Discretionary sales surtaxes; legislative intent; authorization and use of proceeds. -- It is the 9 legislative intent that any authorization for imposition of a 10 11 discretionary sales surtax shall be published in the Florida 12 Statutes as a subsection of this section, irrespective of the 13 duration of the levy. Each enactment shall specify the types 14 of counties authorized to levy; the rate or rates which may be imposed; the maximum length of time the surtax may be imposed, 15 16 if any; the procedure which must be followed to secure voter approval, if required; the purpose for which the proceeds may 17 be expended; and such other requirements as the Legislature 18 19 may provide. Taxable transactions and administrative 20 procedures shall be as provided in s. 212.054. 21 (8) PUBLIC SCHOOL SURTAX.--22 (a) The school board in each county may levy, pursuant to resolution conditioned to take effect only upon approval by 23 24 a majority vote of the electors of the county voting in a 25 referendum, a discretionary sales surtax at a rate that may 26 not exceed 0.5 percent. 27 (b) The resolution shall include a statement that the 28 funds collected shall be used to improve teacher compensation, provide teachers with health care benefits, and provide 29 additional flexible funding for the operation and maintenance 30 of public schools within the district. The statement shall 31 2

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conform to the requirements of s. 101.161 and shall be placed 1 2 on the ballot by the governing body of the county. The 3 following questions shall be placed on the ballot: 4 5 ....FOR THE....CENTS TAX ....AGAINST THE....CENTS TAX б 7 8 (c) The resolution providing for the imposition of the surtax shall set forth a plan for use of the surtax proceeds 9 10 in the following manner: 1. Sixty percent shall be allocated for increases in 11 12 instructional personnel salaries and related employee benefits 13 for health insurance and prescription drug programs. For 14 purposes of this subsection, "instructional personnel" 15 includes classroom teachers, pupil personnel service providers, librarians/media specialists, other instructional 16 staff, and instructional paraprofessionals as defined in s. 17 228.041 who are employed in the public school system. Any 18 19 classroom teacher or adjunct educator who is not state 20 certified pursuant to s. 231.17 is not eligible to receive proceeds from this surtax. 21 2. Forty percent shall be allocated for the 22 23 maintenance and operation of schools within the school 24 district, exclusive of administrative salaries. (d) The funds distributed pursuant to this subsection 25 26 are in addition to any other appropriation, transfer, or other allocation of public or private funds from any other source 27 28 and shall not supplant, replace, or cause a reduction in other school district funding sources. 29 30 31
