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federal home health regulations to dedicate 4 hours to training in Alzheimer's disease and dementia-related illnesses. This training shall include, but is not limited to, overview of dementia, demonstrating basic skills in communicating with persons with dementia, managing problem behaviors, promoting the client's independence in activities of daily living, and skills in working with families and caregivers.

- (b) The Department of Elderly Affairs, or its designee, shall approve the required training. The department must consider for approval training offered in a variety of formats. The department shall keep a list of current providers who are approved to provide the 4-hour training. The department shall adopt rules to establish standards for the trainers required in this section.
- (c) Upon completing the training listed in this section, the employee shall be issued a certificate that states that the training mandated under this section has been received. The certificate shall be dated and signed by the training provider. The certificate is evidence of completion of this training and the employee is not required to repeat this training if the employee changes employment to a different home health agency, assisted living facility, nursing home, adult day care center, adult family-care home, or hospice.
- (2) An agency licensed under this part which claims that it provides special care for persons who have Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders must disclose in its advertisements or in a separate document those services that distinguish the care as being especially applicable to, or 31 suitable for, such persons. The agency must give a copy of

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all such advertisements or a copy of the document to each person who requests information about the agency and must maintain a copy of all such advertisements and documents in its records. The Agency for Health Care Administration shall examine all such advertisements and documents in the agency's records as part of the license renewal procedure.

Section 1085. Effective July 1, 2003, section 400.55715, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

400.55715 Care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders.--

- (1) As a condition of licensure, adult day care centers licensed under this part must provide to each of their employees, upon beginning employment, basic written information about interacting with persons with Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder.
- (2) All employees who are expected to, or whose responsibilities require them to, have direct contact with clients with Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder must, in addition to being provided the information required in this section, also have an initial training of at least 1 hour completed in the first 3 months after beginning employment. This training must include, but is not limited to, an overview of dementias and must provide basic skills in communicating with persons with dementia.
- (3) An individual who provides direct care shall be considered a direct caregiver and must complete the required 1-hour training and an additional 3 hours of training within 9 months after beginning employment. This training shall include, but is not limited to, managing problem behaviors, promoting the client's independence in activities of daily 31 | living, and skills in working with families and caregivers.

The hospice must give a copy of all such advertisements or a copy of the document to each person who requests information about programs and services for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders offered by the hospice and must maintain a copy of all such advertisements and documents in its records. The agency shall examine all such advertisements and documents in the hospice's records as part of the license renewal procedure.
- (2) A hospice licensed under this part must provide to each of its employees, upon beginning employment, basic written information about interacting with persons with Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder.
