An act relating to constitutional amendments proposed by initiative; amending ss. 100.371 and 101.161, F.S.; requiring the Revenue Estimating Conference to provide an analysis of the estimated fiscal impact to state or local governments resulting from any constitutional amendment proposed by initiative; authorizing the Revenue Estimating Conference to solicit information regarding a proposed initiative amendment; providing for a decision in the event of a tie vote among members of the Revenue Estimating Conference; requiring that a summary analysis of the estimated fiscal impact be included on the ballot following the ballot title and substance of the initiative; providing for construction of the act in pari materia with laws enacted during the Regular Session of the Legislature; providing an effective date.

Section 3. If any law that is amended by this act was also amended by a law enacted at the 2002 Regular Session of the Legislature, such laws shall be construed as if they had been enacted at the same session of the Legislature, and full effect should be given to each if that is possible.

Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
