- (d) "Protective supervision" means a legal status in dependency cases which permits the child to remain safely in his or her own home or other nonlicensed placement under the supervision of an agent of the department and which must be reviewed by the court during the period of supervision as defined in s. 39.01(59).
- (e) "Records of the Department of Children and Family Services" means all documents, papers, letters, maps, books, tapes, photographs, films, sound recordings, data processing software, or other material, regardless of the physical form, characteristics, or means of transmission, made or received by the Department of Children and Family Services or its contract provider in the course of an investigation of child abuse, protective supervision, foster care and related services, or abuse of an elderly person or disabled adult.
- (2) It is unlawful for any person to knowingly falsify, alter, destroy, deface, overwrite, remove, or discard records of the Department of Children and Family Services or its contract provider with the intent to conceal a fact material to a child abuse investigation, protective supervision, foster care and related services, or investigations of abuse of an elderly person or disabled adult. Any person violating this subsection commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 948.01, a court may not suspend, defer, or withhold adjudication of guilt or imposition of sentence for any violation of this section.

(4) This section does not apply to the disposal of records or the archiving of records of the Department of Children and Family Services as otherwise provided by law. In addition, this section does not prohibit any person from correcting or updating records, so long as the original record entries are not altered or destroyed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
