14	(b) <u>Challenger/Columbia</u> Challenger license plate, \$25,
15	except that a person that purchases 1,000 or more <u>of such</u>

21	(2) <u>CHALLENGER/COLUMBIA</u> CHALLENGER LICENSE PLATES
22	(a) The department shall develop a <u>Challenger/Columbia</u>
23	Challenger license plate to commemorate the seven astronauts who
24	died when the space shuttle Challenger exploded on liftoff in
25	1986 and the seven astronauts who died when the Columbia
26	exploded on reentry in 2003. The word "Florida" shall appear at
27	the top of the plate, and the <u>words "Challenger/Columbia"</u>
28	"Challenger" must appear at the bottom of the plate, both words
29	in small letters.

(b) Fifty percent of the Challenger/Columbia Challenger 30 license plate annual use fee must be distributed to the 31 Astronauts Memorial Foundation, Inc., to support the operations 32 of the Center for Space Education and the Education Technology 33 Institute. Funds received by the Astronauts Memorial Foundation, 34 Inc., may be used for administrative costs directly associated 35 with the operation of the center and the institute. These funds 36 must be used for the maintenance and support of the operations 37 of the Center for Space Education and the Education Technology 38 Institute operated by the Astronauts Memorial Foundation, Inc. 39 40 These operations must include preservice and inservice training in the use of technology for the state's instructional personnel 41 in a manner consistent with state training programs and approved 42 by the Department of Education. Up to 20 percent of funds 43 received by the Center for Space Education and the Education 44 Technology Institute may be expended for administrative costs 45 directly associated with the operation of the center and the 46 institute. 47
