An act relating to criminal offenses; providing a popular name; amending s. 812.0145, F.S.; providing for a mandatory term of imprisonment for certain thefts against persons 65 years of age or older; changing the dollar values which constitute differing levels of the offense; amending s. 825.103, F.S.; providing for a mandatory term of imprisonment for certain acts of exploitation against an elderly person or disabled adult; changing the dollar values which constitute differing levels of the offense; amending s. 921.0022, F.S.; ranking such offenses on the offense severity ranking chart of the Criminal Punishment Code; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. This act shall be known by the popular name "The Seniors' Safety Act of 2003."
