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A bill to be entitled An act relating to background screening for emergency medical technicians and paramedics; amending s. 401.27, F.S.; requiring that an applicant for certification submit certain arrest and court records to the Department of Health; requiring that an applicant for initial certification or for the first certification renewal after a specified date submit fingerprints to the department for a national criminal history check; requiring a statewide criminal history check for subsequent renewals of certification; providing that an applicant who has submitted information to the Department of Health for a criminal history check is not required to submit such information to certain other agencies for employment or licensure; providing that an applicant who has undergone a criminal history check as a firefighter within a specified period is not required to submit fingerprints to the department; providing for the Office of State Fire Marshal to provide criminal history information concerning such an applicant to the department; providing for tolling the period for issuing a certificate if an applicant must appear before the department due to information obtained through the criminal history check; providing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsections (3) and (5) of section 401.27, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

401.27 Personnel; standards and certification.--

(3)(a) Any person who desires to be certified or recertified as an emergency medical technician or paramedic must apply to the department under oath on forms provided by the department which shall contain such information as the department reasonably requires, which may include affirmative evidence of ability to comply with applicable laws and rules. The department shall require any applicant who has been convicted or found guilty of, or has entered a plea of nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, any offense other than a minor traffic violation, to submit arrest and certified court records stating the nature of the offense and the final disposition of the case so that a determination can be made by the department whether the offense relates to the practice as an emergency medical technician or paramedic or the ability to practice as an emergency medical technician or paramedic. The department shall determine whether the applicant meets the requirements specified in this section and in rules of the department and shall issue a certificate to any person who meets such requirements.

(b) In addition to any other requirements of this section, each applicant for initial certification or the first renewal of certification after July 1, 2003, must, in conjunction with the application for certification or renewal of such certification and under procedures adopted by the department, submit a set of fingerprints to the department.

The applicant must submit the fingerprints on a form and under procedures specified by the department, along with payment in an amount equal to the costs incurred by the department for a

 national criminal history check. For subsequent renewals, an applicant who has already submitted fingerprints and information for a national criminal history check to the department must submit only that information necessary to conduct a statewide criminal history check, along with payment in an amount equal to costs incurred by the department for a statewide criminal history check.

- (c)1. The department shall submit the fingerprints provided by an applicant for initial certification to the Department of Law Enforcement for a statewide criminal history check and the Department of Law Enforcement shall forward the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history check of the applicant.
- 2. The department shall submit the fingerprints provided by an applicant for the first renewal of certification after July 1, 2003, to the Department of Law Enforcement for a statewide criminal history check and the Department of Law Enforcement shall forward the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history check.
- 3. For any subsequent renewal of the applicant's certificate, the department shall submit the required information for a statewide criminal history check of the applicant to the Department of Law Enforcement.
- (d) The department shall review the results of the criminal history check and issue a certificate to an applicant who has met all of the other requirements for certification as an emergency medical technician or paramedic and who has no criminal history. However, for each applicant that has a criminal history, the department must make a determination as

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30 31 to whether a license should be issued to that applicant and under what conditions pursuant to s. 401.411.

(e) An applicant for initial certification or renewal of certification who submits to the department a set of fingerprints and information required for the criminal history check required under this section is not required to provide a subsequent set of fingerprints or other duplicate information required for a criminal history check to the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Department of Juvenile Justice, or the Department of Children and Family Services for employment or licensure with such agency or department if the applicant has undergone a criminal history check as a condition of initial certification or renewal of certification as an emergency medical technician or paramedic with the department, notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary. In lieu of such duplicate submission, the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Department of Juvenile Justice, and the Department of Children and Family Services shall obtain criminal history information for employment or licensure of persons certified under this section from the department.

(f) If an applicant has undergone a criminal history check as a condition of employment or certification as a firefighter under s. 633.34, the Division of State Fire Marshal of the Department of Financial Services shall provide the criminal history information regarding the applicant seeking certification or renewal of certification under this section to the department. Any applicant for initial certification or renewal of certification who has already submitted a set of fingerprints and information to the Division of State Fire Marshal of the Department of Financial Services for the criminal history check required for

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employment and certification of firefighters under s. 633.34 within 2 years after application under this section is not required to provide to the department a subsequent set of fingerprints or other duplicate information required for a criminal history check if the applicant submits an affidavit attesting that he or she has been a state resident for the previous 2 years.

(5) The certification examination must be offered monthly. The department shall issue an examination admission notice to the applicant advising him or her of the time and place of the examination for which he or she is scheduled. Individuals achieving a passing score on the certification examination may be issued a temporary certificate with their examination grade report. If the applicant meets all the requirements of this section and no basis for denial of certification exists, the department must issue an original certification within 45 days after the examination. This 45-day period to issue a certificate is tolled if the applicant must appear before the department due to information provided on the application or obtained through the criminal history check. Examination questions and answers are not subject to discovery but may be introduced into evidence and considered only in camera in any administrative proceeding under chapter 120. If an administrative hearing is held, the department shall provide challenged examination questions and answers to the administrative law judge. The department shall establish by rule the procedure by which an applicant, and the applicant's attorney, may review examination questions and answers in accordance with s. 119.07(3)(a).

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003.

SENATE SUMMARY Requires that an applicant for certification as an emergency medical technician or paramedic submit certain arrest and court records to the Department of Health. Requires that an applicant for initial certification or for the first certification renewal after July 1, 2003, submit fingerprints to the department for a national criminal history check. Requires a statewide criminal history check for subsequent renewals of certification. Provides that a criminal history check conducted by the Office of State Fire Marshal within the previous 2 years for purposes of certification as a firefighter may be used by the department for certifying an emergency medical technician or paramedic. Provides that the 45-day period for issuing a certificate is tolled if an applicant must appear before the department due to information obtained through the criminal history check.
