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HB 1529 2003

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to nursing home facilities; providing that the Agency for Health Care Administration must require that a portion of a nursing home facility's per diem be earmarked for increases in the wages or benefits of eligible staff members; providing definitions; providing exclusions; providing minimum requirements; providing agency duties and responsibilities; providing rulemaking authority; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Medicaid per diem for nursing homes; portion to benefit staff.--

The Agency for Health Care Administration shall require that a portion of a nursing home facility's Medicaid per diem be earmarked for increases in the wages, benefits, or a combination thereof for each eligible staff member. This earmarked portion, which is to be known by the term "wage and benefit pass-through," must be sufficient to provide for an increase in the amount of \$1 per hour in wages, benefits, or a combination thereof for the facility's eligible staff members. As used in this subsection, the term "eligible staff member" includes each employee of the nursing home except the administrator and the director of nursing; however, the term excludes agency, temporary, pool, or home-office staff members who are not directly employed by and assigned exclusively to the facility. Bonuses may not be paid from the earmarked wage and benefit pass-through. The wage and benefit pass-through funds may be used to provide new or improved benefits or to decrease



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the percentage of the cost paid by an eligible staff member for

benefits as of July 1, 2003. Funds may not be used to decrease

the percentage of the cost paid by facilities for existing

benefits.

- (2) The agency shall monitor the application of the wage and benefit pass-through provisions by facilities as provided in this section.
- (3) The agency may adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section, including the determination of the amount to be earmarked, the method of allocation to be used by facilities, and reports necessary to permit the agency to perform its duties under subsection (2).
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003.
