The local 23 government also must have considered the proposed development's 24 impacts on the Florida Intrastate Highway System, as defined in 25 section 338.001, Florida Statutes. <u>A loc</u>al government in Broward 26 County may also grant an exemption from impact fees for 27 28 transportation facilities if a major public or private postsecondary institution of higher learning has an interest or 29 an option to obtain an interest of more than 25 percent in the 30
