**Senate Amendment (with title amendment)**

On page 40, lines 1-12,  
delete those lines

and insert:

Section 45. Paragraphs (h) and (i) of subsection (1)  
of section 1011.62, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

1011.62 Funds for operation of schools.--If the annual  
allocation from the Florida Education Finance Program to each  
district for operation of schools is not determined in the  
annual appropriations act or the substantive bill implementing  
the annual appropriations act, it shall be determined as  
follows:

(1) COMPUTATION OF THE BASIC AMOUNT TO BE INCLUDED FOR  
OPERATION.--The following procedure shall be followed in  
determining the annual allocation to each district for  
operation:

(h) Small, isolated high schools.--Districts that

1 exclusive of millage for capital outlay purposes levied

 6 or better for the previous year; ~~provided the percentage of~~

 10 ~~whichever is greater.~~ For the purpose of this section, the  
 11 term "small, isolated high school" means any high school which  
 12 is located no less than 28 miles by the shortest route from  
 13 another high school; which has been serving students primarily  
 14 in basic studies provided by sub-subparagraphs (c)1.b. and c.  
 15 and may include subparagraph (c)4.; and which has a membership  
 16 of no more than 100 students, but no fewer than 28 students,  
 17 in grades 9 through 12.
