1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to specialty license plates; amending s. 3 320.08056, F.S.; providing annual use fees for specified specialty license plates; amending s. 320.08058, F.S.; 4 5 creating the UNITY license plate, the Family Values 6 license plate, the Parents Make A Difference license 7 plate, the Florida National Guard license plate, and the 8 Family First license plate; providing for the distribution 9 of annual use fees received from the sale of such plates; 10 providing an effective date. 11 12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 13 14 Paragraphs (mm), (nn), (oo), (pp), and (qq) are 15 added to subsection (4) of section 320.08056, Florida Statutes, 16 to read: 17 Specialty license plates. --18 The following license plate annual use fees shall be 19 collected for the appropriate specialty license plates: 20 UNITY license plate, \$25. ( mm ) 21 Family Values license plate, \$25. (nn) 22 Parents Make A Difference license plate, \$25. 23 (pp) Family First license plate, \$25. 24 (qq) Florida National Guard license plate \$25. 25 Subsections (39), (40), (41), (42), and (43) 26 are added to section 320.08058, Florida Statutes, to read: 27 Specialty license plates .--320.08058 28 UNITY LICENSE PLATES. --

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(a) The department shall develop a UNITY license plate as provided in this section. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the word "UNITY" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the British-American Foundation, Inc. Up to 25 percent of such funds shall be used for marketing and promotion of the "UNITY" concept and license plate. The remaining funds shall be used in the following manner:
- 1. Twenty-five percent shall be used to establish and administer advice centers that will provide informative and educational informational materials and referral services to assist recently arrived residents, prospective residents, and individuals in adapting to living, working, and doing business in the State of Florida, particularly to prevent fraudulent conduct.
- 2. Twenty-five percent shall be distributed as grants as determined by an internal review committee to organizations whose efforts are specifically directed toward protecting Florida residents from fraudulent business practices, corporate scams, identity theft, and other fraud.
- 3. Ten percent shall be distributed to identified agencies to assist them with efforts that are specifically directed toward providing Florida residents with a toll-free hotline to fight fraud and corporate scams.
- 4. Ten percent shall be used to pay the cost of professional advice and guidance to protect Florida residents from fraudulent business practices, to promote ethical business



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practices, and to provide informational seminars disseminating
information and materials to prevent fraudulent conduct.

- 5. Five percent shall be expended by the British-American Foundation, Inc., for administrative costs directly associated with the foundation's operations as they relate to its goals of fighting fraud.
  - (40) FAMILY VALUES LICENSE PLATES. --
- (a) The department shall develop a Family Values license plate as provided in this section. The words "Family Values" must appear at the top of the plate, and the word "Florida" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to Sheridan

  House, Inc., to fund residential care programs, family

  counseling, social services for single parents and their

  children, resources materials, and facility construction.

  Sheridan House, Inc., shall distribute the Family Values license

  plate annual use fees in the following manner:
- 1. Sheridan House, Inc., shall retain all revenues from the sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plates have been recovered.
- 2. Up to 5 percent of the funds received by Sheridan
  House, Inc., shall be expended for administrative costs directly
  associated with the operations of Sheridan House, Inc., and up
  to 20 percent of the funds received shall be expended for
  promotion and marketing of the license plate.
- 3. All remaining funds shall be expended by Sheridan House, Inc., for programs.
  - (41) PARENTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE LICENSE PLATES. --



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(a) The department shall develop a Parents Make A

Difference license plate as provided in this section. The words

"Parents Make A Difference" must appear at the top of the plate,
and the word "Florida" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to The Gathering/USA, Inc., to fund personal counseling for parents, marriage seminars, Dads and Moms That Make A Difference seminars, father-and-son retreats, mother-and-daughter retreats, and personal parenting behavioral assessments. The Gathering/USA, Inc., shall distribute the Parents Make A Difference license plate annual use fees in the following manner:
- 1. The Gathering/USA, Inc., shall retain all revenues from the sale of such plates until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plates have been recovered.
- 2. Up to 5 percent of the funds received by The Gathering/USA, Inc., shall be expended for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of The Gathering/USA, Inc., and up to 20 percent of the funds received shall be expended for promotion and marketing of the license plate.
- 3. All remaining funds shall be expended by The Gathering/USA, Inc., for programs.
  - (42) FAMILY FIRST LICENSE PLATES.--
- (a) The department shall develop a Family First license plate as provided in this section. The word "Family First" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to Family
  First to fund programs, projects, seminars, events, and family



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resources that promote principles for building marriages,
guiding parents and single parents, and raising children. The
Family First Foundation shall distribute the Family First
license plate annual use fees in the following manner:

- 1. The Family First Foundation shall retain all revenues from the sale of said plate until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered.
- 2. Up to 5 percent of the funds received by Family First shall be expended for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of Family First. Up to 20 percent of the funds received by Family First shall be expended for promotion and marketing of the license plate.
- 3. Family First shall expend all remaining funds for programs.
  - (43) FLORIDA NATIONAL GUARD LICENSE PLATES.--
- (a) The department shall develop a Florida National Guard license plate as provided in this section. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "National Guard" must appear at the bottom of the plate. The Florida National Guard Seal, 2 3/4" in diameter, must appear in the center of the plate in proper colors.
- (b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the For Giving Foundation, Inc., to fund the Florida National Guard Foundation and Florida faith-based s. 501(c) organizations. The For Giving Foundation, Inc., shall distribute the Florida National Guard license plate annual use fees in the following manner:



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1. The For Giving Foundation, Inc., shall retain all revenues from the sale of said plate until all startup costs for developing and establishing the plate have been recovered.

- 2. Up to 5 percent of the funds received by the For Giving Foundation, Inc., shall be expended for administrative costs directly associated with the operations of the foundation. Up to 20 percent of the funds received shall be expended for promotion and marketing of the license plate.
- 3. Fifty percent of the funds received by the For Giving Foundation, Inc., shall be distributed to the Florida National Guard Foundation.
- 4. Twenty-five percent of the funds received by the For Giving Foundation, Inc., shall be expended to Florida faithbased s. 501(c) organizations.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003.
