An act relating to transportation; creating pt. II of ch. 339, F.S., entitled "Florida Strategic Intermodal System"; creating the Florida Strategic Intermodal System; providing legislative findings, declaration, and intent; providing for components of the system; providing for the designation of facilities in the system; requiring the Department of Transportation to develop a Strategic Intermodal System Plan; providing criteria for the development and revision of such plan; creating the Strategic Intermodal Transportation Advisory Council;

providing legislative findings and purpose; defining
"intermodal modes of transportation," "intermodal
transportation project," and "SITAC"; providing for
intermodal project funding review by districts of the

department, the council, and the Legislature; amending s. 339.08, F.S.; authorizing the payment of costs of projects

on the Florida Strategic Intermodal System as a use of moneys in the State Transportation Trust Fund; providing

an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Chapter 339, Florida Statutes, is designated part I of said chapter and part II, consisting of sections 339.61, 339.62, 339.63, 339.64, and 339.65, is created to read:

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 $\underline{\mbox{(1)}}$  There is created the Florida Strategic Intermodal System.

The Legislature finds that increasing demands are continuing to be placed on the state's transportation system by a fast-growing economy, continued population growth, and projected increases in freight movement, international trade, and tourism. The Legislature also finds that the state's growing regional and intercity economic centers will increase the demand for interregional and intercity travel and that the evolving service-based and information-based industries will change the type of transportation system that business and industry demands, increasing the importance of speed and reliability. The Legislature further finds that our transportation system must be designed and operated in such a way that it preserves the abundance of natural and manmade amenities that have been so successful in attracting new residents, businesses, and tourists to this state. Therefore, the Legislature declares that the development of a strategic intermodal system, composed of facilities and services of statewide and interregional significance, will efficiently serve the mobility needs of Florida's citizens, businesses, and visitors and will help Florida become a worldwide economic leader, enhance economic prosperity and competitiveness, enrich quality of life, and reflect responsible environmental stewardship. To that end, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Strategic Intermodal System consist of transportation facilities of compelling state interest and that limited resources available for the implementation of statewide and interregional transportation priorities be focused on that system.

- (2) During the development of the Strategic Intermodal System Plan and the development of all subsequent updates, the department shall provide metropolitan planning organizations, regional planning councils, local governments, transportation providers, affected public agencies, and citizens with an opportunity to participate in and comment on the development of the proposed plan or update.
- (3) The Strategic Intermodal System Plan shall include the following:
  - (a) A needs assessment.
  - (b) A project prioritization process.
- (c) A map of facilities designated as Strategic Intermodal System facilities and facilities that are emerging in importance that are likely to be designated as part of the system in the future.
- (d) A finance plan based on projections of revenues that can reasonably be expected. The finance plan shall include both 10-year and 20-year cost-feasible components.
- 339.65 Strategic Intermodal Transportation Advisory
  Council created; membership; responsibilities.--
- (1) LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.--The Legislature finds that the geographic makeup and economic diversity of the State of Florida present unique transportation challenges to citizens and tourists traveling throughout the state; that all modes of transportation play an important role in ensuring the

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efficient and safe movement of people and goods throughout the state; and that, if Florida is to remain a competitive and safe location for international and domestic trade, the state must ensure the continued viability of efficient and cost-effective modes of transportation. It is the purpose of this section to ensure that transportation policy and specific transportation projects are coordinated to stimulate the state's economy and allow for the safe and efficient movement of people and goods throughout the state.

- (2) DEFINITIONS. -- As used in this section:
- (a) "Intermodal modes of transportation" means airports and seaports and rail, trucking, and public transit transportation modes and transportation connections between and among these modes.
- (b) "Intermodal transportation project" means any project relating to an intermodal mode or modes of transportation as defined herein.
- (c) "SITAC" means the Strategic Intermodal Transportation Advisory Council.
- (3) STRATEGIC INTERMODAL TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY

  COUNCIL.--The Strategic Intermodal Transportation Advisory

  Council is created to advise and make recommendations to the

  Legislature, the Department of Transportation, and federal

  transportation agencies on policies, planning, and funding of

  intermodal transportation projects in this state. The council's

  responsibilities shall include, but not be limited to:
- (a) Advising the department on the policies, planning, and implementation of the Strategic Intermodal System.
- (b) Providing advice and recommendations to the Legislature on funding for intermodal transportation projects.



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HB 1805 2003 (4) 150 MEMBERSHIP.--The members of Strategic Intermodal Transportation 151 (a) Advisory Council shall consist of the following members: 152 Four intermodal industry representatives selected by 153 the Governor as follows: 154 155 Two representatives from airports involved in the movement of freight and people from their airport facility to 156 another transportation mode. - 2. The initial appointments made by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall serve terms concurrent with those of the respective appointing officer. Beginning January 15, 2005, and for all subsequent appointments, council members appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall serve 2-year terms, concurrent with the term of the respective appointing officer.
- 3. The initial appointees, and all subsequent appointees, made by the Governor shall serve 2-year terms.
- 4. Vacancies on the council shall be filled in the same manner as the initial appointments.
- (c) Each member of the council shall be allowed one vote.

  The council shall select a chair from among its membership.

  Meetings shall be held at the call of the chair, but not less frequently than quarterly. The members of the council shall be reimbursed for per diem and travel expenses as provided in s.

  112.061.
- (d) The department shall provide administrative staff support and shall ensure that council meetings are electronically recorded. Such recordings and all documents received, prepared for, or used by the council in conducting its business shall be preserved pursuant to chapters 119 and 257.
  - (5) INTERMODAL PROJECT FUNDING REVIEW.--
- (a) Each district of the department shall, on an annual basis, review all intermodal transportation project applications to determine which projects meet the criteria listed in s.

  339.63(2). By December 1, 2003, and annually thereafter, the department shall submit to the Strategic Intermodal

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Transportation Advisory Council an unranked list of qualified 210 intermodal transportation project applications that it has reviewed.

- (b) The Strategic Intermodal Transportation Advisory Council shall evaluate all of the project applications that are submitted to it annually by each of the districts of the department. At least 30 days before the start of each regular legislative session, the council shall develop and submit to the Legislature for review an unranked list of projects that qualify pursuant to s. 339.63(2).
- (c) The Strategic Intermodal Transportation Advisory Council shall develop a methodology for scoring and ranking project proposals, based on the criteria referenced in s. 339.63(2). The council may select a project based on other factors as it determines; however, such other factors must be fully documented in writing by the council when it submits its list of recommended projects to the Legislature.
- Section 2. Paragraph (m) of subsection (2) of section 339.08, Florida Statutes, is redesignated as paragraph (n) and a new paragraph (m) is added to said subsection to read:
  - 339.08 Use of moneys in State Transportation Trust Fund. --
- These rules must restrict the use of such moneys to the following purposes:
- (m) To pay the cost of projects on the Florida Strategic Intermodal System developed pursuant to s. 339.61.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
