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22	Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 48.183, Florida
23	Statutes, is amended to read:
24	48.183 Service of process in action for possession of
25	premises
26	(1) In an action for possession of any residential
27	premises <u>, including those under chapters 83, 723, and 513,</u> or
28	nonresidential premises, if the tenant cannot be found in the
29	county or there is no person 15 years of age or older residing
30	at the tenant's usual place of abode in the county after at
31	least two attempts to obtain service as provided above in this
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1 subsection, summons may be served by attaching a copy to a 2 conspicuous place on the property described in the complaint 3 or summons. The minimum time delay between the two attempts to obtain service shall be 6 hours. Nothing herein shall be 4 5 construed as prohibiting service of process on a tenant as is б otherwise provided on defendants in civil cases. 7 Section 2. Section 320.08015, Florida Statutes, is 8 created to read: 9 320.08015 License tax surcharge.--10 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), there is 11 levied on each license tax imposed under s. 320.08(11) a surcharge in the amount of \$1, which shall be collected in the 12 same manner as the license tax and shall be deposited in the 13 Florida Mobile Home Relocation Trust Fund, as created in s. 14 723.06115. This surcharge may not be imposed during the next 15 registration and renewal period if the balance in the Florida 16 Mobile Home Relocation Trust Fund exceeds \$10 million on June 17 30. The division may, after December 31, 1993, by rule, increase the amount of the annual fee to an amount not 21 to exceed \$5 for each mobile home lot to fund operation of the 22 division. In the event that mediation of a dispute concerning 16 17 any matters addressed in this section was not requested in accordance with this section, neither party shall have the 18 19 right to file an action in circuit court, as provided in s. 723.0381, on such matters. (b) The failure on the part of a mobile home park owner or developer to disclose fully all fees, charges, or assessments shall prevent the park owner or operator from collecting such fees, charges, or assessments; and a refusal by the mobile home owner to pay any undisclosed charge shall not be used by the park owner or developer as a cause for eviction in any court of law.

10 (c) It is unlawful for any mobile home park owner or 11 developer to make any agreement, written or oral, whereby the fees authorized in this subsection will be split between such 12 13 mobile home park owner or developer and any mobile home dealer, unless otherwise provided for in this chapter. Any 14 15 person who violates any of the provisions of this paragraph is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as 16 17 provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

(d) With respect to the first rental agreement for a 18 19 mobile home lot in a developing park, the park has the right 20 to condition such initial rental agreement upon the prospective resident's purchasing the mobile home from a 21 dealer chosen by the park developer. A park developer may 22 also buy down rentals on the initial rental agreement of a 23 24 mobile home lot, and such buy-downs may be split between the owner of a developing park and the dealer. 25

(e) Whenever an entrance fee is charged by a mobile home park owner or developer for the entrance of a mobile home into the park and such mobile home is moved from the park before 2 years have passed from the date on which the fee was charged, the fee shall be prorated and a portion returned as follows:

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1 1 The entrance fee shall be refunded at the rate of 2 one twenty-fourth of such fee for each month short of 2 years 3 that the mobile home owner maintained his or her mobile home 4 within the park. 5 The entrance fee shall be refunded within 15 days 2 б after the mobile home has been physically moved from the park. 7 8 No new entrance fee may be charged for a move within the same 9 park. This paragraph does not apply in instances in which the 10 mobile home owner is evicted on the ground of nonpayment of 11 rent; violation of a federal, state, or local ordinance; or violation of a properly promulgated park rule or regulation or 12 13 leaves before the expiration date of his or her rental 14 agreement. However, the sums due to the park by the mobile home owner may be offset against the balance due on the 15 16 entrance fee. 17 (2) No person shall be required by a mobile home park owner to pay an exit fee upon termination of his or her 18 19 residency. 20 (3) No entrance fee may be charged by the park owner to the purchaser of a mobile home situated in the park that is 21 offered for sale by a resident of the park. 22 (4) Except as expressly preempted by the requirements 23 24 of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, a 25 mobile home owner or the park owner shall be authorized pursuant to this section to site any size new or used mobile 26 home and appurtenances on a mobile home lot in accordance with 27 28 the lot sizes, separation and setback distances, and other 29 requirements in effect at the time of the approval of the 30 mobile home park. 31

Subsections (1), (4), and (5) of section 2 723.061, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 3 723.061 Eviction; grounds, proceedings .--4 (1) A mobile home park owner may evict a mobile home 5 owner, a mobile home tenant, a mobile home occupant, or a б mobile home only on one or more of the grounds provided in 7 this section. (a) Nonpayment of lot rental amount. If a mobile home 8 9 owner or tenant, whichever is responsible, fails to pay the 10 lot rental amount when due and if the default continues for 5 11 days after delivery of a written demand by the mobile home park owner for payment of the lot rental amount, the park 12 13 owner may terminate the tenancy. However, if the mobile home 14 owner or tenant, whichever is responsible, pays the lot rental 15 amount due, including any late charges, court costs, and attorney's fees, the court may, for good cause, deny the order 16 17 of eviction, provided such nonpayment has not occurred more than twice. 18 19 (b) Conviction of a violation of a federal or state 20 law or local ordinance, which violation may be deemed 21 detrimental to the health, safety, or welfare of other residents of the mobile home park. The mobile home owner or 22 mobile home tenant will have 7 days from the date that notice 23 24 to vacate is delivered to vacate the premises. This paragraph 25 shall be grounds to deny an initial tenancy of a purchaser of a home pursuant to s. 723.061(1)(e) or to evict an unapproved 26 27 occupant of a home. 28 (c) Violation of a park rule or regulation, the rental 29 agreement, or this chapter. 1. For the first violation of any properly promulgated 30 31 rule or regulation, rental agreement provision, or this 10

1 chapter which is found by any court having jurisdiction 2 thereof to have been an act which endangered the life, health, 3 safety, or property of the park residents or employees or the 4 peaceful enjoyment of the mobile home park by its residents, 5 the mobile home park owner may terminate the rental agreement, б and the mobile home owner, tenant, or occupant will have 7 7 days from the date that the notice is delivered to vacate the premises. 8

9 2. For a second violation of the same properly 10 promulgated rule or regulation, rental agreement provision, or 11 this chapter within 12 months, the mobile home park owner may terminate the tenancy if she or he has given the mobile home 12 13 owner, tenant, or occupant written notice within 30 days of 14 the first violation, which notice specified the actions of the mobile home owner, tenant, or occupant which caused the 15 violation and gave the mobile home owner, tenant, or occupant 16 17 7 days to correct the noncompliance. The mobile home owner, tenant, or occupant must have received written notice of the 18 19 ground upon which she or he is to be evicted at least 30 days 20 prior to the date on which she or he is required to vacate. A second violation of a properly promulgated rule or regulation, 21 22 rental agreement provision, or this chapter within 12 months of the first violation is unequivocally a ground for eviction, 23 24 and it is not a defense to any eviction proceeding that a 25 violation has been cured after the second violation. Violation of a rule or regulation, rental agreement provision, or this 26 chapter after the passage of 1 year from the first violation 27 28 of the same rule or regulation, rental agreement provision, or 29 this chapter does not constitute a ground for eviction under this section. 30

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No properly promulgated rule or regulation may be arbitrarily
applied and used as a ground for eviction.

3 (d) Change in use of the land comprising the mobile 4 home park, or the portion thereof from which mobile homes are 5 to be evicted, from mobile home lot rentals to some other use, б provided all tenants affected are given at least 6 months' 7 notice of the projected change of use and of their need to secure other accommodations. The park owner may not give a 8 notice of increase in lot rental amount within 90 days before 9 10 giving notice of a change in use.

11 (e) Failure of the purchaser, prospective tenant, or occupant of a mobile home situated in the mobile home park to 12 13 be qualified as, and to obtain approval to become, a tenant or 14 occupant of the home, if such approval is required by a properly promulgated rule. If a purchaser or prospective 15 tenant of a mobile home situated in the mobile home park 16 17 occupies the mobile home before approval is granted, the 18 mobile home owner or mobile home tenant shall have 7 days from 19 the date the notice of the failure to be approved for tenancy 20 is delivered to vacate the premises.

(4) A mobile home park owner applying for the removal 21 22 of a mobile home owner, tenant, occupant, or a mobile home, or both, shall file, in the county court in the county where the 23 24 mobile home lot is situated, a complaint describing the lot 25 and stating the facts that authorize the removal of the mobile home owner, tenant, occupant, or and the mobile home. 1 (1) If a mobile home owner is required to move due to 2 a change in use of the land comprising the mobile home park as 3 set forth in s. 723.061(1)(d) and complies with the requirements of this section, the mobile home owner is 4 5 entitled to payment from the Florida Mobile Home Relocation б Corporation of: 7 (a) The amount of actual moving expenses of relocating 8 the mobile home to a new location within a 50-mile radius of 9 the vacated park, or 10 (b) The amount of 3,000, for a single-section 11 mobile home or\$6,000\$10,000 for a multisection mobile home, 12 whichever is less.
