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12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:			
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14	Section 1. Section 215.5605, Florida Statutes, is			
15	created to read:			
16	215.5605 Center for Universal Research to Eradicate			
17	Disease.			
18	(1) The Legislature finds that an estimated 128			
19	million Americans suffer from acute, chronic, and degenerative			
20	diseases and that biomedical research is the key to finding			
21	cures for these diseases that negatively affect all			
22	Floridians. The Legislature further finds that, while there is			
23	much research being conducted throughout this state and			
24	throughout the world, there is a lack of coordination of			
25	efforts among researchers. The Legislature, therefore, finds			
26	that there is a significant need for a coordinated effort if			
27	the goal of curing disease is to be achieved. Moreover, the			
28	Legislature finds that the biomedical technology sector meets			
29	the criteria of a high-impact sector, pursuant to s. 288.108,			
30	having a high importance to this state's economy with a			
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1 significant potential for growth and contribution to our universities and quality of life. 2 3 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that Florida strive to become the nation's leader in biomedical research 4 5 and commit itself to being the state to find cures for the б most deadly and widespread diseases. It is further the intent 7 of the Legislature that there be a coordinated effort among 8 the state's public and private universities and the biomedical industry to discover such cures. Moreover, it is the intent of 9 10 the Legislature to expand the state economy by attracting 11 biomedical researchers and research companies to this state. (3) There is established the Center for Universal 12 Research to Eradicate Disease, which shall be known as the 13 14 'CURED." The purpose of the center is to coordinate, 15 (a) improve, expand, and monitor all biomedical research programs 16 17 within the state, facilitate funding opportunities, and foster improved technology transfer of research findings into 18 19 clinical trials and widespread public use. (b) The goal of the center is to find cures for 20 diseases such as cancer, heart disease, lung disease, 21 diabetes, and neurological disorders, including Alzheimer's 22 disease, epilepsy, and Parkinson's disease. 23 24 (C) The center shall hold an annual biomedical technology summit in Florida to which biomedical researchers, 25 biomedical technology companies, business incubators, 26 27 pharmaceutical manufacturers, and others around the nation and world are invited to share biomedical research findings in 28 29 order to expedite the discovery of cures. Summit attendees will be required to cover the costs of such attendance or 30 31 obtain sponsorship for such attendance.

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1 (d) The center shall encourage clinical trials in this state on research that holds promise of curing a disease or 2 3 condition. The center shall facilitate partnerships between researchers, treating physicians, and community hospitals for 4 5 the purpose of sharing new techniques and new research б findings, as well as coordinating voluntary donations to 7 ensure an adequate supply of adult stem cells, cord blood, and 8 other tissues needed for biomedical research. 9 The center shall also encourage the discovery and (e) production in Florida of vaccines that prevent disease. 10 11 (f) The center shall monitor the supply and demand 12 needs of researchers relating to stem cell research and other types of human tissue research. If the center determines that 13 there is a need for increased donation of human tissue, it 14 shall notify hospitals licensed pursuant to chapter 395 that 15 have entered into partnership agreements with research 16 17 institutes conducting stem cell research located in the same geographic region as the researchers demanding the stem cells 18 19 or other tissues. Such hospitals shall then implement programs that encourage voluntary donations of cord blood or other 20 21 needed tissues. 22 The center shall be funded through private, state, (q) and federal sources. 23 24 (h) The center shall serve as a registry of all known 25 biomedical grant opportunities and may assist any public or 26 private biomedical research program in this state in preparing 27 grant requests. The center shall maintain a website with links to 28 (i) 29 peer-reviewed biomedical research. The website shall also 30 contain a list of all known biomedical research being 31

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1 conducted in Florida and shall facilitate communication among researchers and other interested parties. 2 3 (j) The center shall submit an annual report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the 4 5 House of Representatives no later than January 15 which contains recommendations for legislative change necessary to 6 7 foster a positive climate for biomedical research in this 8 state. 9 (k) The duties of the center may be outsourced to a 10 private entity or state university. 11 (4) There is established within the center an advisory 12 council which shall meet at least annually. 13 (a) The council shall consist of the members of the board of directors of the Florida Research Consortium and at 14 15 least one representative from: 16 1. The Emerging Technology Commission. 17 2. Enterprise Florida, Inc. 18 3. BioFlorida. 19 4. The Florida Biomedical Research Advisory Council. The Florida Medical Foundation. 20 5. 21 6. Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of 22 America. 23 (b) Members of the council shall serve without 24 compensation and each organization represented shall cover all 25 expenses of its representative. 26 Section 2. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1), 27 subsection (2), and paragraph (f) of subsection (10) of section 215.5602, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 28 29 215.5602 Florida Biomedical Research Program.--30 (1) There is established within the Department of 31 Health the Florida Biomedical Research Program funded by the 4

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1 proceeds of the Lawton Chiles Endowment Fund pursuant to s. 2 215.5601. The purpose of the Florida Biomedical Research 3 Program is to provide an annual and perpetual source of 4 funding in order to support research initiatives that address 5 the health care problems of Floridians in the areas of б tobacco-related cancer, cardiovascular disease, stroke, and 7 pulmonary disease. The long-term goals of the program are to: 8 (a) Improve the health of Floridians by researching 9 better prevention, diagnoses, and treatments, and cures for 10 cancer, cardiovascular disease, stroke, and pulmonary disease. 11 (b) Expand the foundation of biomedical knowledge relating to the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment, and cure 12 13 of diseases related to tobacco use, including cancer, cardiovascular disease, stroke, and pulmonary disease. 14 (2) Funds appropriated for the Florida Biomedical 15 Research Program shall be used exclusively for the award of 16 17 grants and fellowships as established in this section; for 18 research relating to the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment, 19 and cure of diseases related to tobacco use, including cancer, 20 cardiovascular disease, stroke, and pulmonary disease; and for expenses incurred in the administration of this section. 21 22 Priority shall be granted to research designed to prevent or 23 cure disease. 24 (10) The council shall submit an annual progress report on the state of biomedical research in this state to 25 the Governor, the Secretary of Health, the President of the 26 Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by 27 28 February 1. The report must include: 29 (f) Progress in the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment, and cure of diseases related to tobacco use, 30 31
