30	NOTICE TO TAXPAYER AND PHYSICIAN: Section 196.131(2), Florida
31	Statutes, provides that any person who shall knowingly and

willfully give false information for the purpose of claiming homestead exemption shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable by a term of imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a fine not exceeding \$5,000, or both. Section 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 2004.
