This act may be cited as the "Citizens' 15 Empowerment Act." Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 16 17 97.041, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 97.041 Qualifications to register or vote .--18 19 (2) The following persons, who might be otherwise 20 qualified, are not entitled to register or vote: 21 (b) A person who has been convicted of any felony by 22 any court of record; however, such a person's right to register or vote is automatically restored by operation of law 23 24 6 months after completion and satisfaction of all sentences 25 imposed upon such person. For the purposes of this paragraph, 26 "completion and satisfaction of all sentences" occurs when a 27 person is released from incarceration upon expiration of 28 sentence and has achieved or completed all other nonmonetary 29 terms and conditions of the sentence or subsequent supervision 30 or, if the person has not been incarcerated for the felony offense, has achieved or completed all nonmonetary terms and 31 1

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conditions of community supervision imposed by a court and who has not had his or her right to vote restored pursuant to law. If a majority of the Board of Executive Clemency objects before the automatic restoration of the right to register or vote, such rights shall be restored only upon application to, and approval by, the Board of Executive Clemency. Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 97.052, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 97.052 Uniform statewide voter registration application.--(2) The uniform statewide voter registration application must be designed to elicit the following information from the applicant: (a) Full name. (b) Date of birth. (c) Address of legal residence. (d) Mailing address, if different. (e) County of legal residence. (f) Address of property for which the applicant has been granted a homestead exemption, if any.

(s) That the applicant has not been convicted of a 18 19 felony or, if convicted, has had his or her civil rights 20 restored. (t) That the applicant has not been adjudicated 21 22 mentally incapacitated with respect to voting or, if so adjudicated, has had his or her right to vote restored. 23 24 The registration form must be in plain language and designed 25 so that convicted felons whose voting civil rights have been 26 restored and persons who have been adjudicated mentally 27 28 incapacitated and have had their voting rights restored are 29 not required to reveal their prior conviction or adjudication. An indication that the applicant has not been 12 6. 13 convicted of a felony or that, if convicted, has had his or 14 her voting civil rights restored. 7. An indication that the applicant has not been 15 adjudicated mentally incapacitated with respect to voting or 16 17 that, if so adjudicated, has had his or her right to vote 18 restored. 19 8. Signature of the applicant swearing or affirming 20 under the penalty for false swearing pursuant to s. 104.011 21 that the information contained in the registration application is true and subscribing to the oath required by s. 3, Art. VI 22 of the State Constitution and s. 97.051. 23 Section 5. Subsection (1) of section 98.0977, Florida 24 Statutes, is amended to read: 25 98.0977 Statewide voter registration database; 26 27 development and maintenance .--28 (1) From the funds appropriated, the department may 29 contract with the Florida Association of Court Clerks to analyze, design, develop, operate, and maintain a statewide, 30 31 on-line voter registration database and associated website, to 4

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1 be fully operational statewide by June 1, 2002. The database 2 shall contain voter registration information from each of the 3 67 supervisors of elections in this state and shall be 4 accessible through an Internet website. The system shall 5 provide functionality for ensuring that the database is б updated on a daily basis to determine if a registered voter is 7 ineligible to vote for any of the following reasons, including, but not limited to: 8 9 (a) The voter is deceased; 10 (b) The voter has been convicted of a felony and has not had his or her voting civil rights restored; or 11 The voter has been adjudicated mentally 12 (C) 13 incompetent and his or her mental capacity with respect to 14 voting has not been restored. 15 The database shall also allow for duplicate voter 16 17 registrations to be identified. Section 6. This act shall take effect on the effective 18 19 date of Senate Joint Resolution No. ____ or another amendment 20 to the State Constitution which authorizes, or removes impediments to, enactment of this act by the Legislature. 21 22 23 24 LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY 25 Creates the "Citizens' Empowerment Act." Provides that a convicted felon who is incarcerated or is on probation, parole, or community control may not vote. Provides for restoration of that right 6 months after completion of 26 27 the sentence, unless automatic restoration is objected to by a majority of the Board of Executive Clemency. 28 29 30 31 5

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
