31	163.3167, F.S.; requiring local governments to		

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1 include projected water use in comprehensive
2 plans; amending s. 367.081, F.S.; revising
3 procedure for fixing and changing rates to
4 include the recovery of costs of alternative
5 water supply facilities; amending s. 367.0814,
6 F.S.; revising limit on the amount of revenues
7 received by a utility to qualify for staff
8 assistance in changing rates or charges;
9 amending s. 373.1963, F.S.; prohibiting the
10 West Coast Regional Water Supply Authority from
11 seeking permits from the South Florida Water
12 Management District for the consumptive use of
13 water from groundwater in a specified area;
14 amending s. 373.0361, F.S.; providing for a
15 public workshop on the development of regional
16 water supply plans that include the
17 consideration of population projections;
18 providing for a list of water source options in
19 regional water supply plans; providing
20 additional regional water supply plan
21 components; including conservation measures in
22 regional water supply plans; revising specified
23 reporting requirements of the Department of
24 Environmental Protection; providing that a
25 district water management plan may not be used
26 as criteria for the review of permits for
27 consumptive uses of water unless the plan or
28 applicable portion thereof has been adopted by
29 rule; providing construction; amending s.
30 373.0831, F.S.; revising the criteria by which
31 water supply development projects may receive

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1 priority consideration for funding assistance;
2 providing for permitting and funding of a
3 proposed alternative water supply project
4 identified in the relevant approved regional
5 water supply plan; amending s. 373.1961, F.S.;
6 providing funding priority; providing for the
7 establishment of a revolving loan fund for
8 alternative water supply projects; providing
9 conditions for certain projects to receive
10 funding assistance; providing severability;
11 providing legislative findings with respect to
12 loss of property values due to the proximity of
13 a regional water reservoir; authorizing a cause
14 of action for a property owner; specifying a
15 period during which a property owner may
16 present a claim for compensation to the
17 regional water supply authority that
18 constructs, operates, and maintains the
19 reservoir; providing requirements for the offer
20 of compensation by a regional water supply
21 authority; providing for judicial review under
22 the Bert J. Harris, Jr., Private Property
23 Rights Protection Act; providing for an award
24 of costs and attorney's fees; providing for
25 future repeal of the section; providing for
26 applicability; creating s. 373.2234, F.S.;
27 authorizing the governing board of a water
28 management district to adopt rules identifying
29 certain preferred water supply sources;
30 providing requirements with respect to such
31 rules; providing construction; amending s.

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1 373.250, F.S.; authorizing water management
2 districts to require the use of reclaimed water
3 in lieu of surface or groundwater when the use
4 of uncommitted reclaimed water is
5 environmentally, economically, and technically
6 feasible; providing construction with respect
7 to such authority; amending s. 373.536, F.S.;
8 expanding requirements of the 5-year water
9 resource development work program for water
10 management districts; providing legislative
11 findings and intent with regard to landscape
12 irrigation design; requiring water management
13 districts to develop landscape irrigation and
14 xeriscape design standards; amending s.
15 378.212, F.S.; providing for the granting of a
16 variance from pt. III of ch. 378, F.S.,
17 relating to phosphate land reclamation, for
18 specified reclamation, and from pt. IV of ch.
19 373, for certain projects under described
20 circumstances; amending s. 378.404, F.S.;
21 authorizing the department to grant variances
22 from the provisions of part IV of chapter 378
23 to accommodate reclamation that provides for
24 water supply development or water resource
25 development under specified circumstances;
26 amending s. 403.064, F.S.; revising provisions
27 relating to reuse feasibility studies;
28 providing for metering use of reclaimed water
29 and volume-based rates therefor; requiring
30 wastewater utilities to submit plans for
31 metering use and volume-based rate structures

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1 to the department; amending s. 403.1835, F.S.;

2 authorizing the Department of Environmental

3 Protection to make specified deposits for the

4 purpose of enabling below-market interest rate

5 loans for treatment of polluted water; amending

6 s. 403.1837, F.S.; deleting certain

7 restrictions on the issuance of bonds by the

8 Florida Water Pollution Control Financing

9 Corporation; providing for a study of the

10 feasibility of discharging reclaimed wastewater

11 into canals and the aquifer system in a

12 specified area as an environmentally acceptable

13 means of accomplishing described objectives;

14 requiring reports; providing an effective date.

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
