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15-986B-03 A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; amending s. 20.331, F.S.; creating the Office of Boating and Waterways within the commission; providing powers and duties of the office; amending s. 206.606, F.S.; providing for the transfer of moneys from the Fuel Tax Collection Trust Fund to the Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund; amending s. 370.0603, F.S.; providing for the use of funds transferred from the Fuel Tax Collection Trust Fund; creating s. 327.47, F.S.; providing for competitive grant programs; providing an effective date. Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 20.331, Florida Statutes, is amended, and paragraph (e) is added to subsection (5) of that section, to read: 20.331 Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission .--(3) The following administrative units are established within the commission: (a) Division of Administrative Services. (b) Division of Law Enforcement. (c) Division of Freshwater Fisheries.

(d) Division of Marine Fisheries.

28 (e) Division of Wildlife.

(f) Florida Marine Research Institute.

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The bureaus and offices of the Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission existing on February 1, 1999, are established within the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. There is created within the commission an office of Boating and Waterways. (5) In further exercise of its duties, the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission: (e) Shall assign to the Office of Boating and Waterways such powers, duties, responsibilities, and functions as are necessary to manage and promote the use of state waterways for safe and enjoyable boating, including oversight and coordination of waterway markers on state waters, providing programs for boating education and boating safety, improving boating access, coordinating the removal of derelict vessels from state waters, economic development initiatives to promote boating in the state, and coordinating the submission of state comments on marine events. Section 2. Paragraph (d) is added to subsection (1) of section 206.606, Florida Statutes, to read: 206.606 Distribution of certain proceeds.--(1) Moneys collected pursuant to ss. 206.41(1)(g) and

21 206.87(1)(e) shall be deposited in the Fuel Tax Collection 22 Trust Fund. Such moneys, after deducting the service charges 23 24 imposed by s. 215.20, the refunds granted pursuant to s. 25 206.41, and the administrative costs incurred by the department in collecting, administering, enforcing, and 26 distributing the tax, which administrative costs may not 27 28 exceed 2 percent of collections, shall be distributed monthly 29 to the State Transportation Trust Fund, except that: 30 31

7	(i) Funding for boating-related programs and
8	activities and for law enforcement on state waters.

10	Conservation Trust Fund from taxes distributed under s.
