A bill to be entitled
An act relating to faith-based initiatives;
creating the Florida Families Faith-Based
Initiative Institute, Inc.; creating a
nonprofit corporation and providing for the
administration of the corporation; providing
that the corporation is not a unit of state
government but is subject to statutory
provisions relating to public records and
public meetings; providing duties of the
corporation; providing for a board of
directors; naming a temporary advisory board;
providing an appropriation; providing an
effective date.

WHEREAS, there is a need for the creation of a nongovernmental entity to serve as a clearinghouse and action-oriented organization to foster, direct, and coordinate the efforts of Florida citizens, communities, and local faith-based organizations, to take advantage of the opportunities offered by the White House Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives and of the Center for Faith-Based and Community Initiatives in five federal executive agencies, as well as similar opportunities at the state level, and

WHEREAS, such a nongovernmental entity could build collaborative partnerships that involve many organizations from the faith-based community, and

WHEREAS, such a nongovernmental entity could assist faith-based organizations with technical assistance in key areas of delivering services to the needy, by assisting with the development of programs of fiscal accountability, program

implementation and evaluation, and organizational and administrative efficiencies, and

WHEREAS, such a nongovernmental entity could act as a catalyst for change between the government and faith-based organizations by assisting the government in recruiting, mobilizing, training, and supporting faith-based organizations engaged in providing social services, and

WHEREAS, Bethel Missionary Baptist Church in Tallahassee, Florida, has created the Hope Project to encourage faith-based organizations to partner with other organizations to create multiple sources of income so that they do not become unnecessarily dependent on specific government grants or projects, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. <u>Florida Families Faith-Based Initiative</u> Institute, Inc.--

(1) CREATION.--The Florida Families Faith-Based
Initiative Institute, Inc., is created as a 501(c)3, Florida
corporation not for profit that is registered, incorporated,
organized, and operated in compliance with chapter 617,
Florida Statutes, and that is not a unit or entity of state
government. The Legislature determines that public policy
dictates that the Florida Families Faith-Based Initiative
Institute, Inc., should operate in the most open and
accessible manner consistent with its public purpose. To this
end, the Legislature specifically declares that the Florida
Families Faith-Based Initiative Institute, Inc., is subject to
the provisions of chapter 119, Florida Statutes, which relate

to public records and to the provisions of chapter 286, Florida Statutes, which relate to public meetings and records.

- (2) DUTIES.--The Florida Families Faith-Based Initiative Institute, Inc., shall:
- (a) Examine competition-based barriers to state-funded or federally funded provision of services by faith-based organizations.
- (b) Provide programmatic and managerial training and technical assistance to faith-based organizations that seek or use state or federal funds to provide services. Such training and technical assistance must focus on critical areas of faith-based social services management, including community asset-based program development, research-based "best program practices," resource development for nonstate funding sources, and financial management and budgeting.
- (c) Establish a statewide resource center and clearinghouse for information relating to technical assistance and training resources for faith-based and community-based organizations.
- (d) Serve, as required, as a fiscal intermediary for faith-based and community-based organizations that receive state or federal funding.
- (e) To the maximum extent possible, leverage state funding for the initiative with any federal funding that the initiative receives to support similar faith-based activities.
- (f) Provide specific goals and objective criteria to measure, evaluate, and document the quality and cost of services provided by faith-based organizations with state or federal funds.
- (g) Serve as liaison to the Centers for Faith-Based
   and Community Initiatives established within the United States

Department of Justice, the United States Department of Health and Human Services, the United States Department of Education, the United States Department of Labor, and the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and to any such initiatives created by the state, to work in tandem with the White House Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives and with any similar state initiatives. (3) BOARD OF DIRECTORS. -- The board of directors of the

- corporation shall consist of seven members, of whom three shall be appointed by the Governor, two by the President of the Senate, and two by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The board shall select a chairperson and may appoint an executive committee to carry on the business of the corporation between board meetings. The board shall meet quarterly. From July 1, 2003, through June 30, 2004, the Bethel Missionary Baptist Church Project Hope Board of Directors shall serve as an advisory board to the corporation.
- FUNDING. -- Notwithstanding sections 216.81 and (4)216.292, Florida Statutes, and pursuant to section 216.351, Florida Statutes, there is appropriated the nonrecurring sum of \$700,000 to fund the Florida Families Faith-Based Initiative Institute, Inc.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
