Thereafter, 50 percent of the proceeds shall be distributed to the Children's Home Society of Florida, which must distribute the funds proportionately to each of its divisions, to be used for child б abuse prevention programs. The other 50 percent of the proceeds shall be distributed to the Florida Network of Children's Advocacy Centers, which must distribute the funds proportionately to its member centers to fund child abuse intervention programs. Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2003. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 310 The CS corrects a reference in order to properly name the Florida Network of Children's Advocacy Centers. The CS deletes a three-fifths vote requirement.

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
