#### Background

The Pinellas County Construction Licensing Board currently consists of representatives from the licensed community as well as lay individuals. The purpose of the Board is to assist in the regulation, certification and licensing of construction contractors and practitioners within Pinellas County. Board members are appointed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners in accordance with the provisions of the Act, except that the building director members from the City of Clearwater, the City of St. Petersburg, and Pinellas County are permanent members.

The current representation established by special acts does not always include a member from a beach community. For instance, one member must be selected from several areas that includes, but is not limited to, Bellair Beach, Largo, Indian Shores, Indian Rocks Beach, Safety Harbor or Pinellas Park.

This bill ensures permanent representation on the board by a representative of beach communities appointed from a list of three nominees submitted by The Barrier Island Governmental Council.
