B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

This bill amends s. 17.06 of the Charter of the City of Jacksonville, as created by Chapter 92-341, Laws of Florida, and exempts additional positions from the civil service system of the Consolidated Government.

Background

The civil service provisions of the Charter of the City of Jacksonville Consolidated Government apply to all employees who are not specifically exempted. The City is in the process of consolidating its housing programs within a newly-created Housing Community Development Commission and Housing Community Development Finance Authority. The City intends to appoint employees to these agencies, while ensuring that present employees retain the right to their civil service positions. The City and the Property Appraiser also wish to codify the status of appointed employees in that office and to confirm the status of employees who have elected to retain their civil service rights.

Current Law

The 1992 Legislature enacted Chapter 92-341, Laws of Florida, which readopted the entire Charter of the City of Jacksonville, as amended locally and by special acts. The Charter subsequently has been amended by the Legislature each year from 1993 to 2001.

Pursuant to House Rule 5.5(a), if the Committee on Local Government & Veterans' Affairs determines that the substance of a local bill may be enacted into law by ordinance of a local governing body, the committee shall not report the bill. However, if a local governing body would be required to call a referendum to enact the substance of a local bill into law, the committee may report the local bill. Section 18.05 of the City of Jacksonville Charter provides that when an amendment to the charter has been properly proposed, a public referendum must be held. Thus, this bill is not subject to House Rule 5.5 (a).

C. SECTION DIRECTORY:

Section 1: Amends s. 17.06 of the Charter of the City of Jacksonville, as created by Chapter 92-341, Laws of Florida, as amended, exempting from the civil service system certain persons employed by the Housing and Community Development Commission (HCDC), the Housing and Community Development Finance Commission (HCDFC), and the Office of the Property Appraiser.

Section 2: Provides an effective date of upon becoming law.
