A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the protection of marine turtles; amending s. 370.021, F.S.; providing a penalty for taking, harvesting, or possessing an egg of certain marine turtle species; providing an additional penalty for each egg involved in such a violation; amending s. 370.12, F.S.; providing penalties for violating the Marine Turtle Protection Act; providing that it is a third degree felony to take, kill, possess, disturb, mutilate, destroy, cause to be destroyed, sell, offer for sale, transfer, molest, or harass a marine turtle or its nest, hatchlings, eggs, or parts thereof; providing that it is a third degree felony to commit any such act that involves a specified number or more of marine turtle eggs; providing that it is a third degree felony to solicit or conspire to violate the Marine Turtle Protection Act; amending s. 777.04, F.S., relating to the offense of criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or criminal conspiracy; providing that a violation of the Marine Turtle Protection Act is exempt from certain sentencing requirements for an offense of solicitation or conspiracy; amending s. 921.0022, F.S., relating to the offense severity ranking chart of the Criminal Punishment Code; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Paragraph (e) of subsection (2) of section 370.021, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:



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370.021 Administration; rules, publications, records; penalties; injunctions.--

- (2) MAJOR VIOLATIONS.--In addition to the penalties provided in paragraphs (1)(a) and (b), the court shall assess additional penalties against any person, firm, or corporation convicted of major violations as follows:
- (e) For a violation involving the taking, harvesting, or possession of any of the following species, which are endangered, threatened, or of special concern, or involving the taking, harvesting, or possession of any egg of a species described in subparagraphs 4.-8.:
  - 1. Shortnose sturgeon (Acipenser brevirostrum);
  - 2. Atlantic sturgeon (Acipenser oxyrhynchus);
  - 3. Common snook (Centropomus undecimalis);
  - 4. Atlantic loggerhead turtle (Caretta caretta caretta);
  - 5. Atlantic green turtle (Chelonia mydas mydas);
  - 6. Leatherback turtle (Dermochelys coriacea);
- 7. Atlantic hawksbill turtle (Eretmochelys imbricata imbracata);
  - 8. Atlantic ridley turtle (Lepidochelys kempi); or
  - 9. West Indian manatee (Trichechus manatus latirostris),

an additional penalty of \$100 for each unit of marine life or part thereof, or an additional penalty of \$100 for each egg of a species described in subparagraphs 4.-8.

Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 948.01, no court may suspend, defer, or withhold adjudication of guilt or imposition of sentence for any major violation prescribed in this subsection. The proceeds from the penalties assessed pursuant to

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this subsection shall be deposited into the Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund to be used for marine fisheries research or into the commission's Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund as provided in s. 372.107, as applicable.

Section 2. Paragraphs (b) and (c) of subsection (1) of section 370.12, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

370.12 Marine animals; regulation.--

- (1) PROTECTION OF MARINE TURTLES. --
- (b) The Legislature intends, pursuant to the provisions of this subsection, to ensure that the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission has the appropriate authority and resources to <a href="mailto:administer">administer</a> implement its responsibilities under the recovery plans of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service for the following species of marine turtle:
  - 1. Atlantic loggerhead turtle (Caretta caretta caretta).
  - 2. Atlantic green turtle (Chelonis mydas mydas).
  - 3. Leatherback turtle (Dermochelys coriacea).
- 4. Atlantic hawksbill turtle (Eretmochelys imbricata imbricata).
  - 5. Atlantic ridley turtle (Lepidochelys kempi).
- Endangered Species Act or its implementing regulations, <u>a</u> no person may <u>not</u> take, possess, disturb, mutilate, destroy, cause to be destroyed, sell, offer for sale, transfer, molest, or harass any marine turtle or its nest or eggs at any time. For purposes of this subsection, <u>the word</u> "take" means an act <u>that which</u> actually kills or injures marine turtles, and includes significant habitat modification or degradation that kills or injures marine turtles by significantly impairing essential behavioral patterns, such as breeding, feeding, or sheltering.



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 $\underline{b.2.}$  Unless otherwise provided by the federal Endangered Species Act or its implementing regulations,  $\underline{a}$  no person, firm, or corporation may  $\underline{not}$  take, kill, disturb, mutilate, molest, harass, or destroy any marine turtle.

- c.3. A No person, firm, or corporation may not possess any marine turtle, their nests, eggs, hatchlings, or parts thereof unless it is in possession of a special permit or loan agreement from the commission enabling the holder to possess a marine turtle or parts thereof for scientific, educational, or exhibitional purposes, or for conservation activities such as relocating nests, eggs, or animals away from construction sites. Notwithstanding any other provisions of general or special law to the contrary, the commission may issue such authorization to any properly accredited person for the purpose of marine turtle conservation upon such terms, conditions, and restrictions as it may prescribe by rule adopted pursuant to chapter 120. The commission shall have the authority to adopt rules pursuant to chapter 120 to permit the possession of marine turtles pursuant to this paragraph. For the purposes of this subsection, a "properly accredited person" is defined as:
- (I) a. Students of colleges or universities whose studies with saltwater animals are under the direction of their teacher or professor;
- (II) b. Scientific or technical faculty of public or private colleges or universities;
- (III) c. Scientific or technical employees of private research institutions and consulting firms;
- (IV) d. Scientific or technical employees of city, county, state, or federal research or regulatory agencies;



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(V) e. Members in good standing or recognized and properly chartered conservation organizations, the Audubon Society, or the Sierra Club;

- $\underline{(VI)}_{f}$ . Persons affiliated with aquarium facilities or museums, or contracted as an agent therefor, which are open to the public with or without an admission fee; or
- (VII) g. Persons without specific affiliations listed above, but who are recognized by the commission for their contributions to marine conservation such as scientific or technical publications, or through a history of cooperation with the commission in conservation programs such as turtle nesting surveys, or through advanced educational programs such as high school marine science centers.
- 2. Any person, firm, or corporation who intentionally commits an act prohibited by subparagraph 1. commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- 3. Any person, firm, or corporation who intentionally commits an act prohibited by subparagraph 1. which involves 12 or more eggs of any species specified in paragraph (b) commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- 4. Notwithstanding s. 777.04, any person, firm, or corporation who solicits or conspires with another person, firm, or corporation to commit an act prohibited by subparagraph 1. commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- Section 3. Paragraphs (a), (d), and (e) of subsection (4) of section 777.04, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
  - 777.04 Attempts, solicitation, and conspiracy.--

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(4) (a) Except as otherwise provided in ss. 104.091(2), 370.12(1), 828.125(2), 849.25(4), 893.135(5), and 921.0022, the offense of criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or criminal conspiracy is ranked for purposes of sentencing under chapter 921 and determining incentive gain-time eligibility under chapter 944 one level below the ranking under s. 921.0022 or s. 921.0023 of the offense attempted, solicited, or conspired to. If the criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or criminal conspiracy is of an offense ranked in level 1 or level 2 under s. 921.0022 or s. 921.0023, such offense is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

- (d) Except as otherwise provided in s. 104.091(2), <u>s.</u> 370.12(1), s. 828.125(2), or s. 849.25(4), if the offense attempted, solicited, or conspired to is a:
  - 1. Felony of the second degree;
  - 2. Burglary that is a felony of the third degree; or
- 3. Felony of the third degree ranked in level 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, or 10 under s. 921.0022 or s. 921.0023,

the offense of criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or criminal conspiracy is a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

(e) Except as otherwise provided in s. 104.091(2), <u>s.</u>

370.12(1), s. 849.25(4), or paragraph (d), if the offense attempted, solicited, or conspired to is a felony of the third degree, the offense of criminal attempt, criminal solicitation, or criminal conspiracy is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
